Why Bereavement Services Matter

- Cemetery Spaces: Remembrance, grief, reflection, memory, personal, calm, connected
- Community matters: Listen, diverse needs, sense of place, accessible

Sector Challenges Nationally

- Limited burial space, ageing infrastructure, rising costs
- Balancing regulation and community needs

- Direct cremation impact

- Climate change: heavy rainfall

- Planning new cemeteries (12–24 hectares)
- Reviewing and optimising existing spaces
- Expanding burial/memorial options
- Building service resilience



Our Strategy in Action: Environmental Responsibility

- Eco-friendly burials, greener memorials
- Biodiversity: wildflowers, habitat management
- Integration with city's green infrastructure
- Community education

Our Strategy in Action: Modernisation and Improvement

- Digitising records, online booking, digital mapping
- Facility improvements: buildings, signage, accessibility
- Piloting digital memorials



Our Strategy in Action: Collaboration & Engagement

- Co-design with faith groups, residents, partners
- Muslim Burial Forum
- Friends of Groups: vital partners
- Ongoing engagement, transparency



Our Strategy in Action: Financial Resilience

- Sustainable funding model, reinvestment
- Exploring commercial opportunities
- Balancing quality and cost
- Long-term service sustainability
