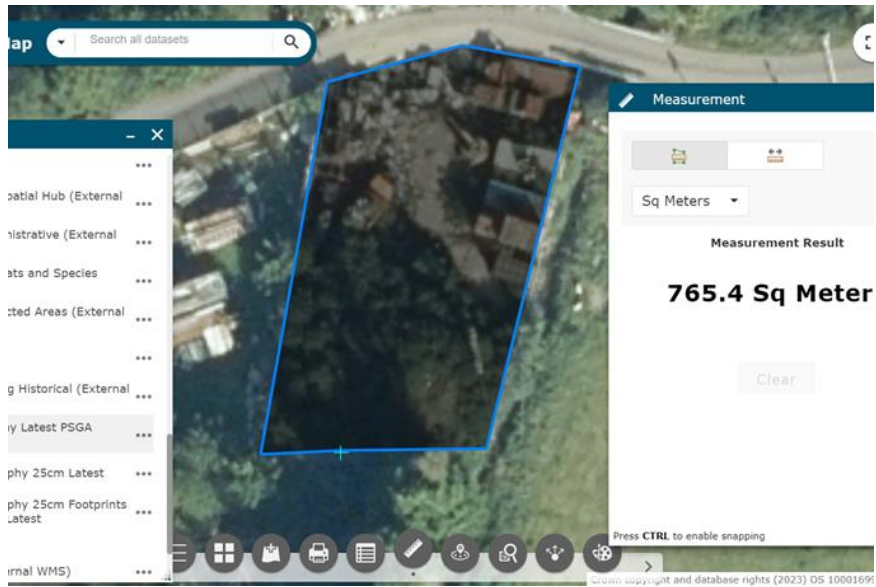
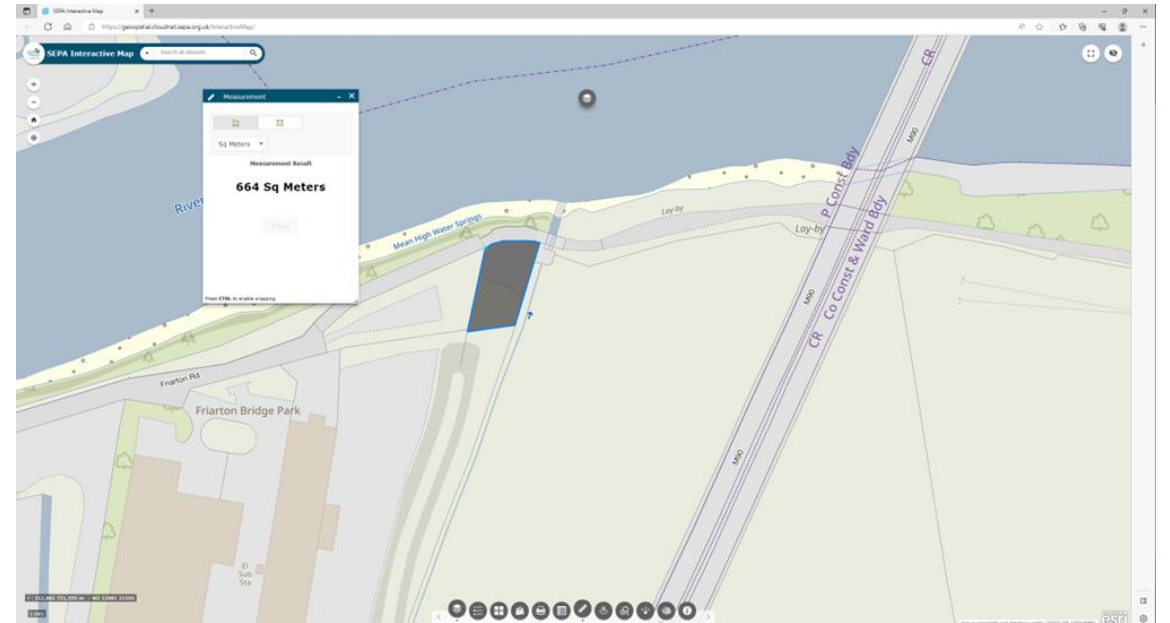
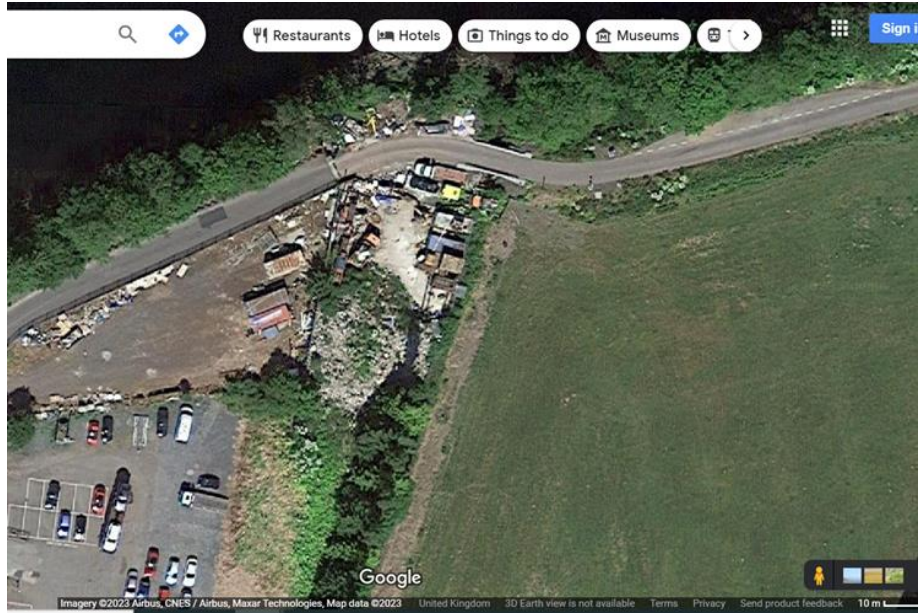


# History

- Private Waste Management company
- Used as a front for 'other' activities
- Site abandoned in 2012. The WML was then revoked. Operator was prosecuted and subsequently jailed for drug related offences.
- Informal and Formal processes failed to enforce owner to clean up site
- Site progressively worsened over time as became a free-for-all Flytipping site for businesses and householder dumping

# History

- Hundreds of complaints received over the years
- Flytipping started to encroach on road way preventing businesses and householders being able to pass
- Waste started to threaten water course - burn running into Tay and River Tay itself
- No funding to clear it up and on private ground
- Loss of amenity

# The project

Funding from Zero Waste Scotland became available

Joint approach with SEPA, PKC, Tay Salmon Fisheries and Scottish Water

Application successful and £10,000 secured

Match funding from Enforcement Undertaking, Scottish Water and PKC to bring pot up to £50,000

In kind support from all project parties

Local Waste Management Company employed to clear up site

Clear up commenced 18<sup>th</sup> March and lasted 3 days.

Focus was to clear the site nearest the water first



# The project continued

Opposite land side was also tackled and significant inroads made

231 tonnes removed from site

Permanent CCTV purchased (solar powered)

Unpaid work team litter picked the area

Palisade fencing supplied & erected by Tay Salmon Fisheries

Large A Frame concrete blocks supplied by Enva (have a site near to location)

Communications plan devised for before and after including direct mailing to households and businesses

# Equipment

Part of the funding was used to purchase 3 permanent HD cameras.

They are solar charged and work off the mobile phone network which was essential due to the remote area.

CCTV signage was also placed at the site.



## Conclusion

- Project a great example of collaborative working
- Funding was invaluable
- Resolved (in part) a problematic historical issue
- Still waste to be cleaned up, but not urgent as not causing any problems
- CCTV proved its worth on day 3 when a flytipper was apprehended and fined
- No further issues in area
