The origin of BNG

- Previously an optional requirement until the Environment Act was passed in 2021.
- It does not change existing legal protections for important habitats and wildlife species.



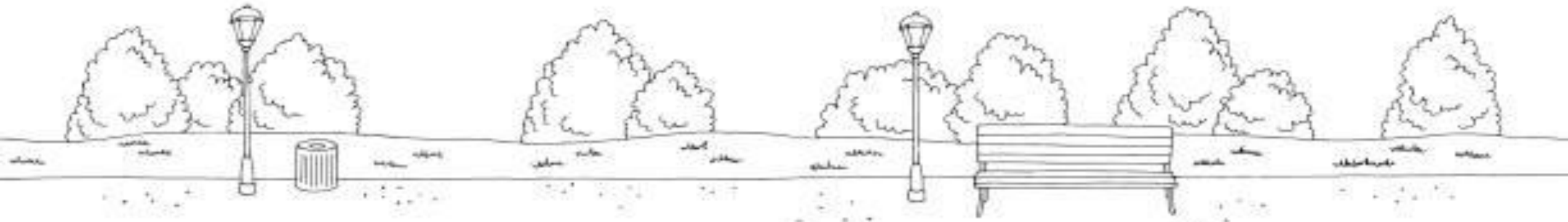
What does this mean and why is this important?

- All planning permissions granted in England will have to deliver at least 10% biodiversity net gain
- Will become a mandatory requirement in November 2023

- apse Workings and application of Biodiversity Net Gain



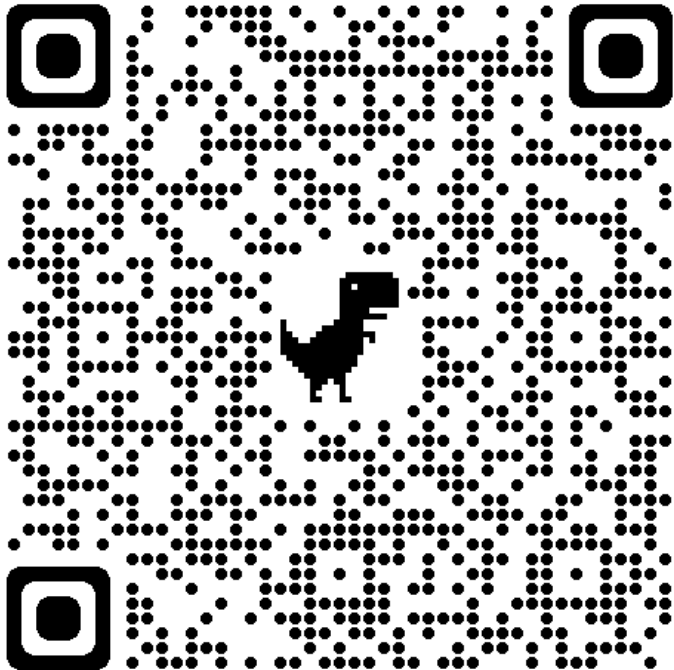
