

The Scottish Innovation Partnership (SIP): Scottish Government and the Hunter Foundation funding projects as part of the Child Poverty strategy.


The project is a collaboration between North Lanarkshire Council and Snook.

Local authorities have identified that thousands of children are entitled to free school meals, but aren't registered.



Not just free school meals

- clothing grant
- free breakfast club
- weekend and holiday club
- Pupil Equity Funding (PEF)
- head teacher salaries
- reduced cost of school trips



2 schools

100+ children.

7 workshops

20 council staff

23 school staff

12 stakeholders

8 parent and carer interviews.

100s of calls, emails and tweets

1 "Dear people in power" booklet

31 memes






School hunger is still a huge issue.



Findings

- 1. Free School Meals are falsely associated with stigma.
- 2. The policy doesn't reach all those who need it
- 3. Uptake is hampered by poor food quality and service provision

How do we register the pupils who are entitled to free school meals?



By October 2019, North
Lanarkshire Council had
identified an **additional**2,472 pupils for

Clothing Grant and Free

School Meals.

The same proportion applied to **Scotland** would mean **35,314 pupils** are missing out.

The system reduces the manual process by 10 to 30 min per child = **saves 18** days a year

In the future

What other benefits could we make more accessible?

E.g. Education Maintenance Allowance,

Open Government licence so that other councils can apply the same approach.
