## Policy update - England

Date	Political announcements, committee reports, policies and legislation
7 <sup>th</sup> February 2017	DCLG publishes long-awaited housing white paper
8 <sup>th</sup> June 2017	General election. Manifestos focus on housing and role of councils
14 <sup>th</sup> June 2017	Grenfell Tower tragedy
17 <sup>th</sup> September 2017	Sajid Javid makes speech committing the government to publish a green paper on social housing
4 <sup>th</sup> October 2017	Prime Minister Theresa May announces additional £2bn for affordable housing and a new social-rent settlement from 2020 at the Conservative Party Conference
22 <sup>nd</sup> November 2017	Autumn Budget announces <b>lifting of Housing Revenue Account borrowing caps</b> for councils in areas of high affordability pressure
30 <sup>th</sup> November 2017	Government announces it is establishing a 'Rough Sleeping Advisory Panel'



## Policy announcements/reviews (cont.)

Date	Political announcements, committee reports, policies and legislation
8 <sup>th</sup> January 2018	Government renames the Department for Communities and Local Government the Ministry of Housing, Communities and Local Government
5 <sup>th</sup> March 2018	Government publishes revised <b>National Planning Policy Framework</b> for 10-week consultation
3 <sup>rd</sup> April 2018	Homelessness Reduction Act 2017 comes into force
30 <sup>th</sup> April 2018	Appointment of <b>James Brokenshire MP</b> as Secretary of State for Housing, Communities and Local Government, replacing Sajid Javid MP
26 <sup>th</sup> June 2018	Government publishes the <i>Additional housing revenue account borrowing programme</i> : a prospectus inviting local authorities in areas of high affordability pressure to bid for additional borrowing to build new council housing
9 <sup>th</sup> July 2018	<b>Kit Malthouse MP</b> is appointed as the new Housing Minister, <b>the eighth housing minister in eight years</b> and the third in just over a year



## Policy announcements/reviews (cont.)

Date	Political announcements, committee reports, policies and legislation
24 <sup>th</sup> July 2018	Government published the <b>final revised National Planning Policy Framework</b> with updated Planning Practice Guidance
9 <sup>th</sup> August 2018	Government announces that all supported housing funding will be covered by the welfare system, dropping a proposed plan to give councils control of funding for short-term accommodation
13 <sup>th</sup> August 2018	Government publishes <b>rough sleeping strategy</b> backed by £100 million funding and a commitment to end rough sleeping entirely by 2027
14 <sup>th</sup> August 2018	Government publishes <i>A New Deal for Social Housing</i> , its Social Housing Green Paper, for consultation until 6 <sup>th</sup> November.  Government also separately publishes the <i>Use of Right to Buy sales</i> consultation, ending on 9 <sup>th</sup> October.



## Will the new policy landscape deliver more genuinely affordable homes?

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#### **Revised NPPF**

- Changes to the **viability test** "the price paid for land is not a relevant justification for failing to accord with relevant policies in the plan"
- Updated definition of affordable housing
- Requirement for 10% of new development as affordable home ownership

#### **Social Housing Green Paper**

- Re-emphasises £2 billion additional funding (including flexibility for social rent)
- The role of innovative and entrepreneurial councils
  - o Reform of use of Right to Buy receipts
  - Potential expansion of lifting Housing Revenue Account borrowing cap
  - More information on expectations of local housing companies






# How would you characterise the need for affordable housing in your local authority area?






## In the past 12 months have the statutory homelessness levels changed in your local authority area?




# What is the dominant model of delivering social and affordable housing in your local authority area?
