










Q18. You said that local services have declined in your local area in recent years. Who do you think is the most responsible for this?






Q19. On a scale from 0 to 10, do you think that enough of your tax is spent on services in your local area?






Q57. Who do you trust the most to make decisions about how services are delivered in your local area?






Q58. Who do you trust the most to make decisions about how services are provided in your local area?





Q60. Who do you think is best placed to implement practical local steps to combat the effects of climate change in the local area?








Q85. To what extent do you support or oppose councils introducing policies and schemes that are designed to directly address air pollution and improve health?





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




PI 39a Percentage of safety inspections completed on time (carriageways) PI 46a Percentage of safety inspections completed on time (footways)






PI 28 Number of emergency (cat 1) defects per km of maintained carriageway























PI 16 Percentage of actual maintenance expenditure (carriageways and footways) which is planned



What is the average age of your highways maintenance operational staff?






Key fact 1: Relative Trust in Councils high

Trust in Councils and Councillors has decreased slightly in the past year, as trust in Government and Ministers has also declined. However, trust in Councils and Councillors is still high overall compared to trust in Government and Ministers.


- <u>Four times as many people trust local councils (49%)</u> to make decisions about how services are delivered in their local areas compared to national government (12%).
- <u>Eight times as many people trust local councillors (51%)</u> more than government ministers (6%) to make decisions about how services are provided in their local area.
- Local councils are trusted more than 4 times than Government or Private companies to deliver services in their area

Councils trusted to deliver services over 4x more than the Government or private companies




Enough of your taxes spent in your area?

Do you think that enough of your tax is spent on services in your local area? [comparison with 2022]




More funding for councils vs Gov to keep more [comparison with 2022]







The plans have been floated by the Conservative-led council, although its current contract with Ringway Jacobs, which was first agreed back in 2012, does not run out for another three years.




National Underground Asset Register (NUAR)

- It will also lead to enhanced communication between parties and improve data quality.


