#### North Lanarkshire



Located in West-Central Scotland, on the eastern boundary of Glasgow

Population 341,400

Largest Local Authority Landlord in Scotland

Stock of 36,302 homes (22.6%)





#### Homeless Legislation in Scotland

Abolished Priority Need in December 2012

Duty to assess for intentionality amended to a Power in 2019 - only assess where there is reason to believe 'deliberate manipulation'

Homeless Etc (Scotland) Act 2003

Suspension of Local Connection Rules in 2022

Duty to provide settled housing to all who have been assessed as unintentionally homeless

#### Homelessness in NL

- Homelessness increased 16% in 2023/24 following a rise of 13% in 2022/23.
- Key reasons for homelessness:
  - Asked to leave 26.1%
  - Relationship Breakdown 16.8%
  - Violent/Abusive Relationship Breakdown 15.1%
- 46% of all applications are from Males
- 31.36% of homeless households contain children
- Repeat homeless applications up by 5.2% from 4.4%
- Average length of stay in temporary accommodation has reduced from 164 days to 131
- Number of children in Temporary Accommodation reduced by 15%
- Council housed approximately 80% of all homeless applicants.



## Housing (Scotland) Bill: Homelessness Prevention

- Introduced to Scottish Parliament on 26th March 2024
- Ask & Act Duty on all public bodies
  - Includes Social Landlords, Local Authorities, NHS Boards, Health & Social Care Boards, Police, Prisons and potentially Courts and Private Landlords.
  - Responsibility to 'ask' if a person they are working with is homeless/at risk of homelessness and then to 'act' to prevent homelessness from occurring.
- Extension of threatened with homelessness from 2 months to 6 months
  - To enable early intervention and take reasonable steps to prevent homelessness
- Mandatory support for tenants affected by Domestic Abuse
  - Support for tenants if they are overdue on their rent because of domestic abuse
  - Requirement to put in place a Policy setting out the support they will provide

## **Impact Considerations**

Likely to lead to increased requests for assistance

Successful delivery of 'ask & act' will be dependent on collaboration, commitment & effort across all key partners

Likely to create additional resource implications
