

• The categories have also been sharpened up so that the Partnership Award is now the Minimise Disruption Award and the Communication Award is now the Keep the Public Fully Informed Award.





Road and Street Works - The Context

- 73 million people by 2035
 - 43% increase in traffic from 2010 to 2040
 - Massive increase in house-building





- 962 miles new strategic roads
- £9 billion on road maintenance of which £6 billion on resurfacing the 3000 miles of strategic roads

...but limited extra investment on local roads – limited additional capacity?
