





Good water level management mitigates flood risk





Climate resilience





Back to Basics







Bring together the senior civil servants of the relevant government departments in a single flood (and drought) resilience group chaired by the Deputy PM





Push for the enabling of Schedule 3 of the Floods & Water Management Act





Plan ahead financially over multiple years with a better balance of capital and revenue funding, spread across entire river catchments.



Immediate Actions



- Publicise simple winter readiness messages using local and social media outlets
 - Increase attention to the maintenance
 of gullies and drains, trash screens,
 etc
- Have Local Resilience Forum meetings ahead of an event to be fully aware of your critical infrastructure and have plans in place to protect it.
