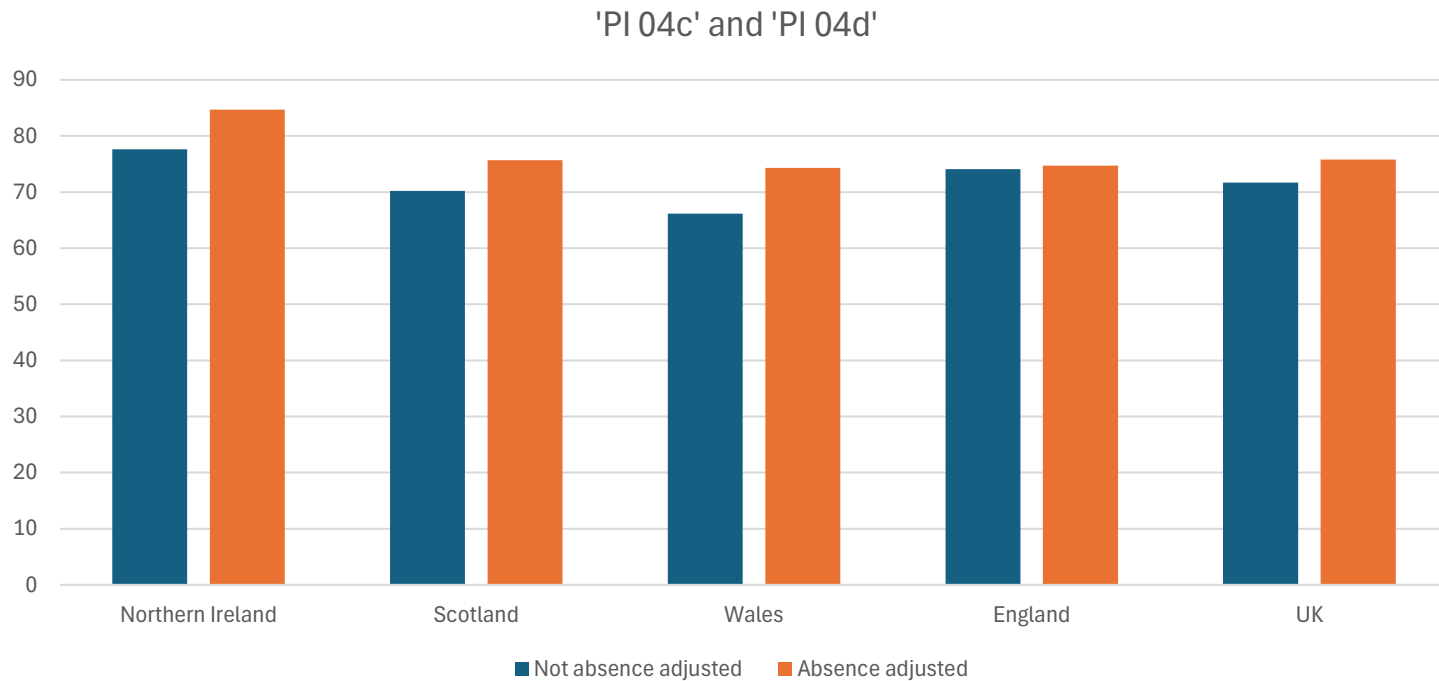

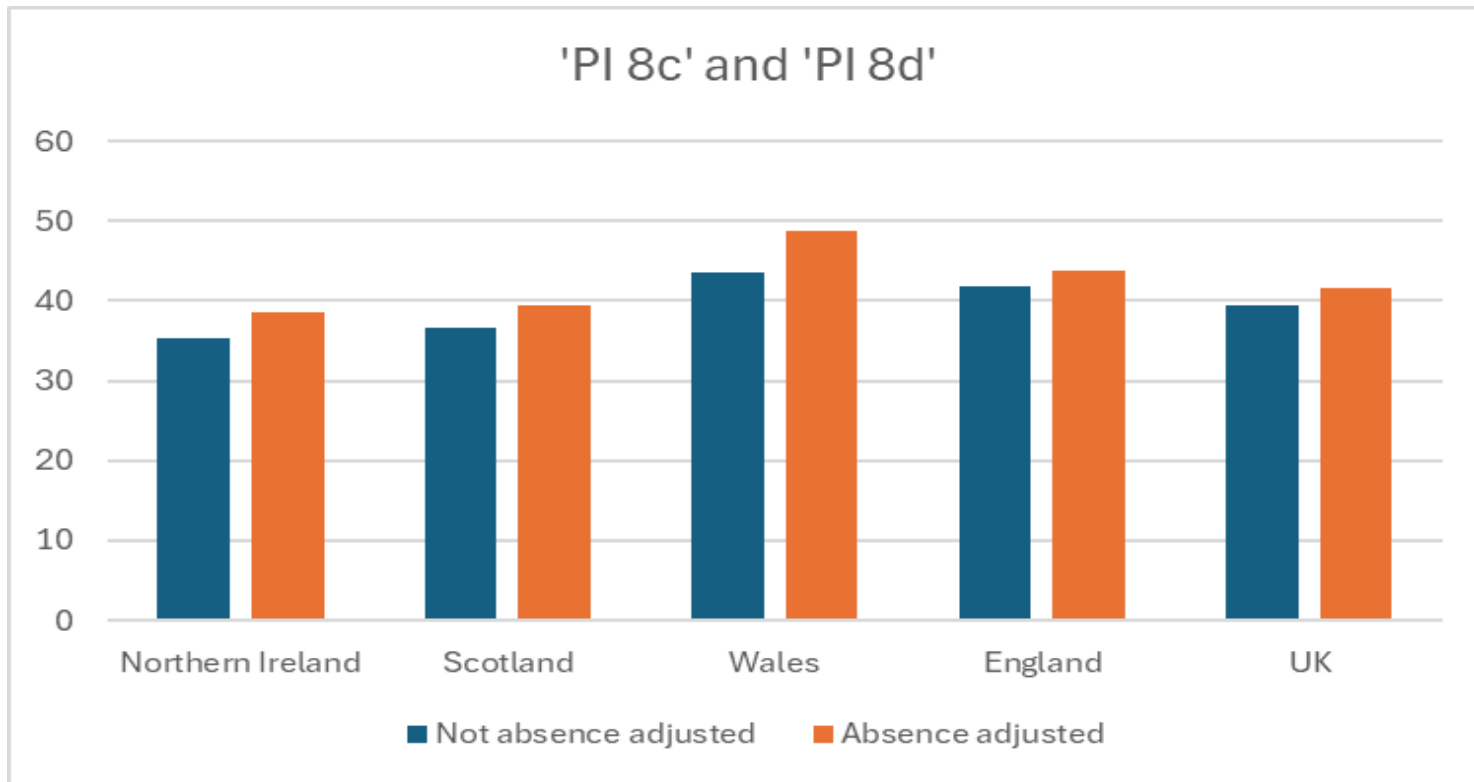

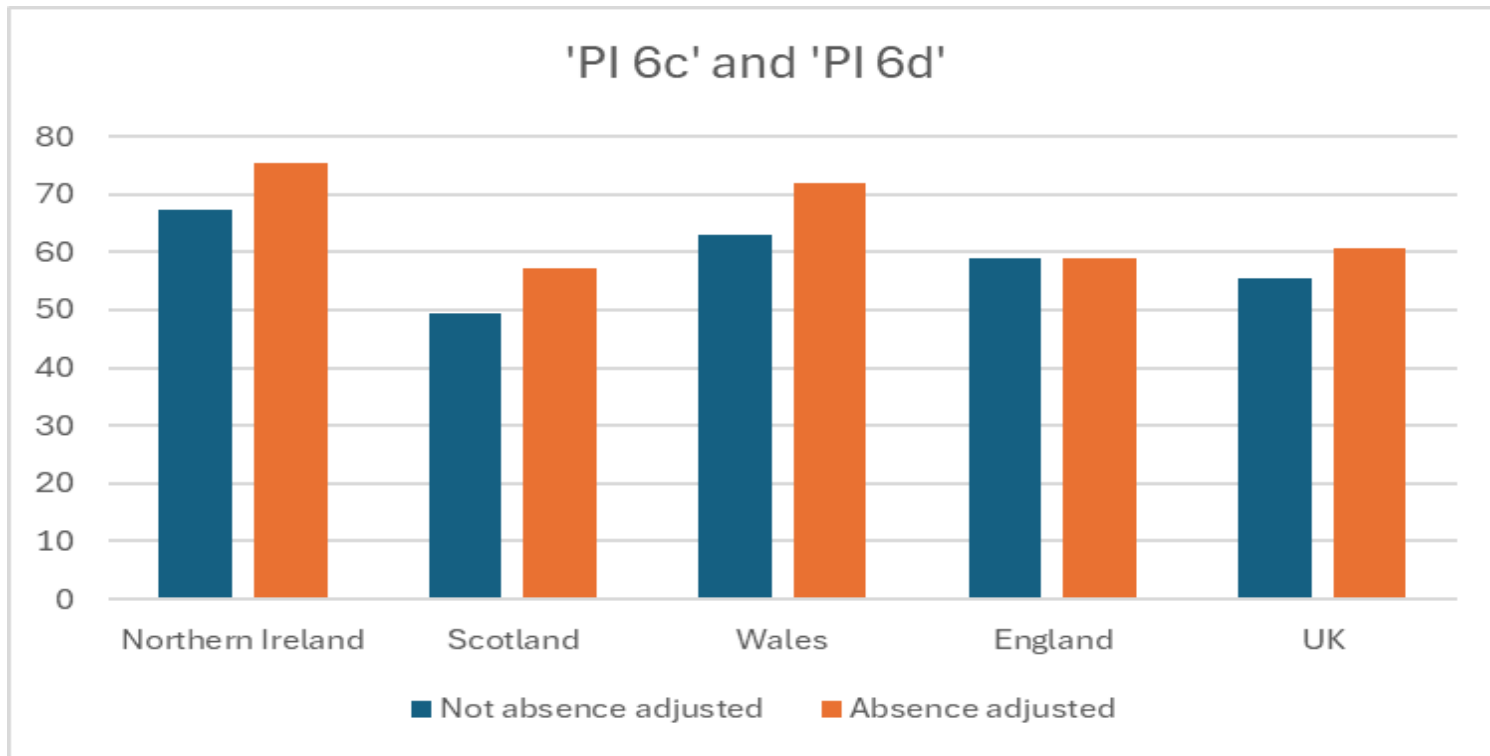
Primary schools free meal uptake (all authorities)



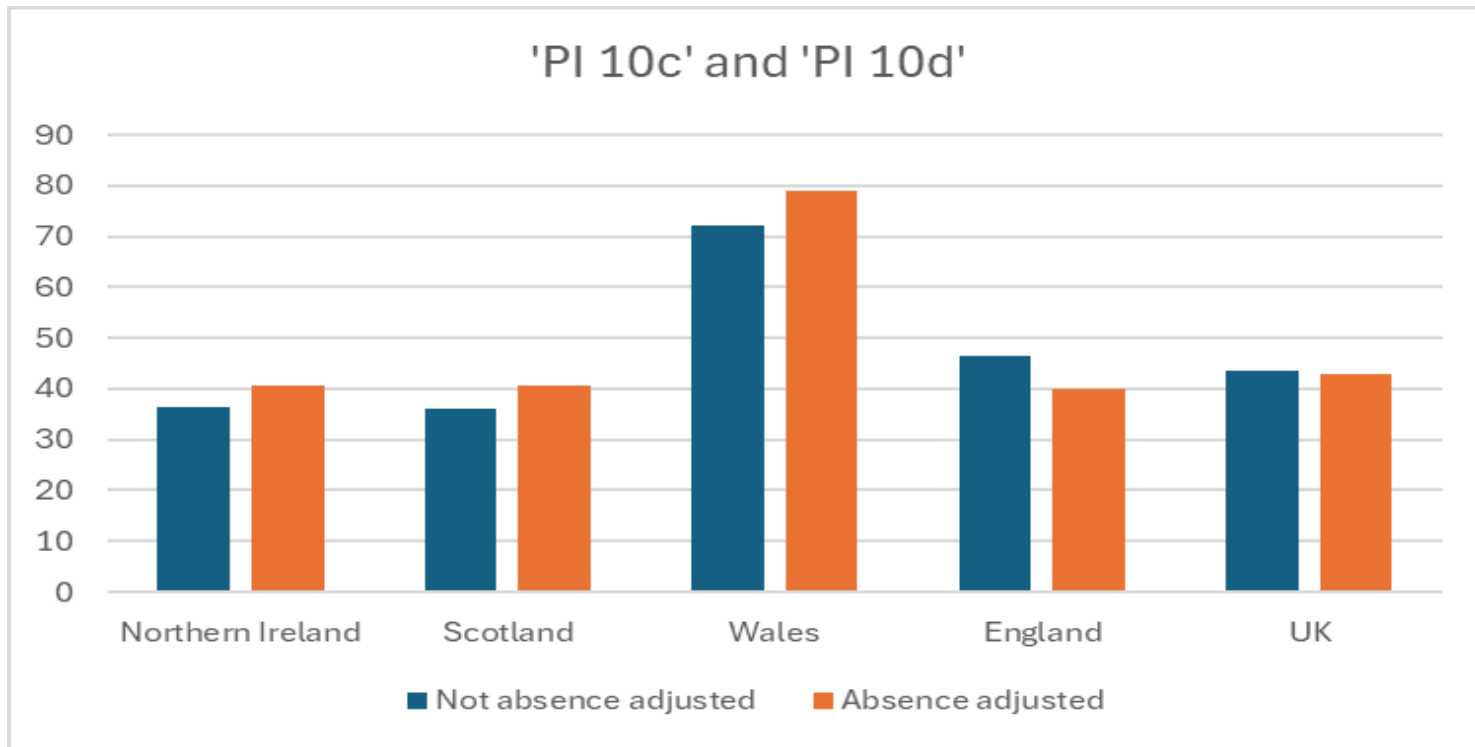
Primary schools paid meal uptake (all authorities)



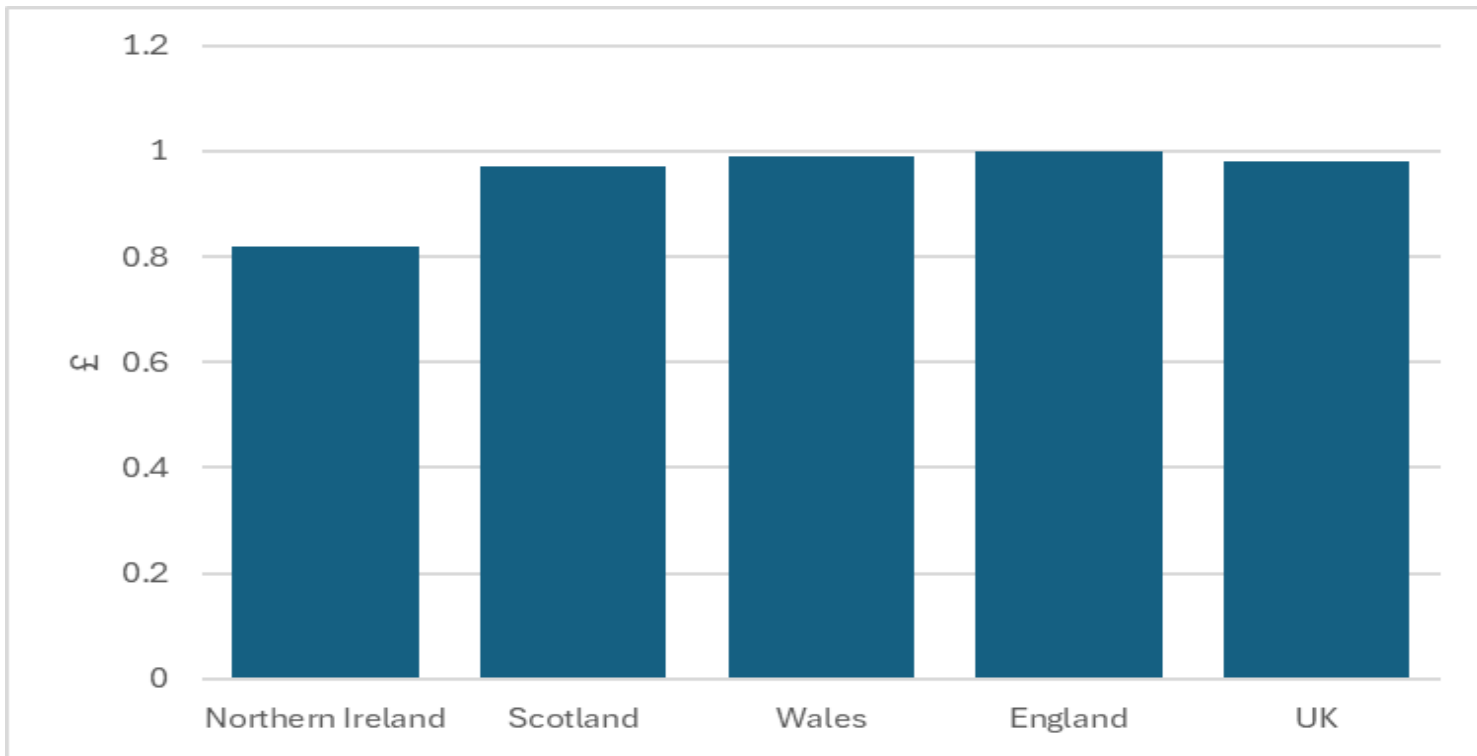
Secondary schools free meal uptake (all authorities)



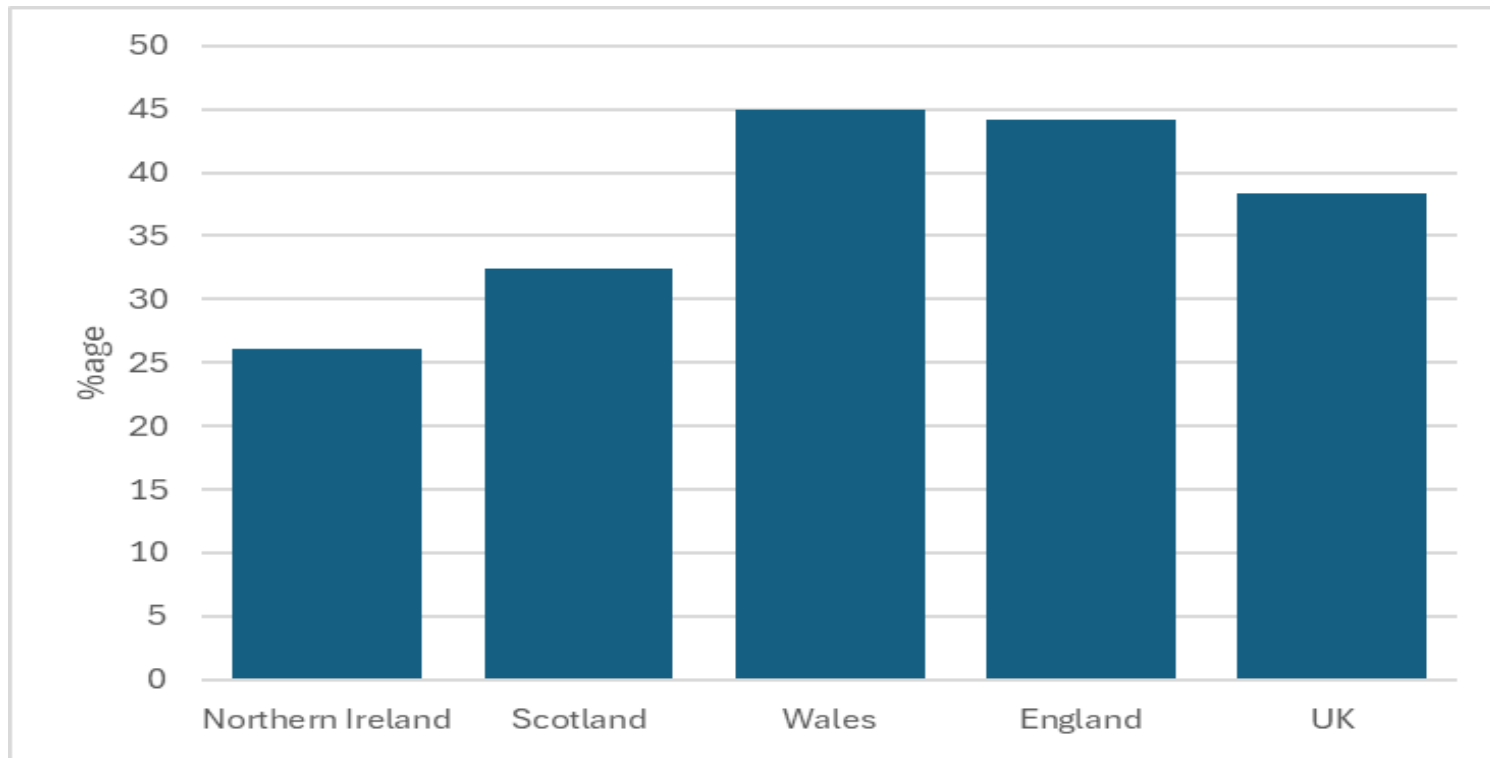
Secondary schools paid meal uptake (all authorities)
