



- No strategic element at regional level (except London)
- Based on the local plans of 335 individual local planning authorities






dominant model of delivering social and affordable housing






Up-to-date plan with five year-land supply?






Has the viability test in the NPPF Helped or Hindered?






Has the New Homes Bonus incentivised the delivery of new social and affordable homes?
