






# COUNCILLORS REMAIN DISSATISFIED WITH THE BALANCE OF POWER




### NORTHERN POWERHOUSE - POPULAR IN PRINCIPLE

"Local politicians in the North, rather than MPs in Westminster, should have control over services like transport and health to improve the region."




The UK government should be responsible for how regional parliaments and local councils deliver public services







## Perceptions of council's performance











...is in a better position to deliver services to local residents than 12 months ago






