Temporary Traffic Restriction Orders

Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984

Powers for traffic authority to restrict or prohibit traffic:

S14(1)(a) – Power to restrict or prohibit traffic due to works

S14(1)(b) – Power to restrict or prohibit traffic because of <u>likelihood of danger or serious damage to road</u> not attributable to works

S14(1)(c) – Power to restrict or prohibit traffic for **street cleaning**



Temporary Traffic Restriction Notices

Powers for traffic authority to issue **NOTICES**

S14(2)(a) – Power to restrict or prohibit traffic due to works or for street cleaning where considered <u>necessary or expedient</u> that the restriction or prohibition should <u>come into force without delay</u>

S14(2)(b) – Power to restrict or prohibit traffic because of likelihood of danger or serious damage to road not attributable to works and the restriction or prohibition should come into force without delay.



ORDER vs NOTICE

ORDER	NOTICE
 Advertising in local press mandatory Lead-in time for advertising Costs associated with advertising Max. duration 18 months (6 months for footpaths etc) 	 No advertising required Shorter lead-in time No costs associated with advertising Max duration 21 days (emergency), 5 days (non-emergency)

Major Works means road works by a works promoter (other than minor works):
