What is Safer Streets Funding?

 Home Office grant to fund initiatives aimed at tackling neighbourhood crime, anti-social behaviour and VAWG, improving the safety of public spaces for all





 Round four ran across 2022/23 and 2023/24 and worth £75 million with maximum bid of £750,000





Focused initiatives within a target area.



Funding Award

- Range of capital and revenue projects in previous rounds.
- CCTV enhancements and control room upgrade.
- Outreach work, safer places project, active bystander training.

- Our Derby Bid awarded nearly £750,000 for this funding round
- Previously awarded funding in:
 - Round 1 £400K
 - Round 3 £550K
- Total Safer Streets fund allocation to £1.7 million



Our Bid – Regulation and Enforcement



- Further expansion of our CCTV provision
- Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) kits
- Purchase of scrambler bike



Our Bid – Support for Young People

A range of initiatives to support young people in the City:

- Education in schools Drugs, Alcohol and Resilience Training
- Programmes with young people at risk of offending or reoffending
- Practical work and learning outdoors / nature based and engineering
- Using Virtual Reality
