Supporting the council objectives

The council set-up a task force gathering members from all areas of business and local schools to become more environmentally friendly and plastic free by 2030. Our catering and cleaning teams are strong advocates for tackling climate change.

As a service area we have not only been able to deliver efficiencies and more sustainable services in line with our local policies, but we have also been 'keeping it green' by supporting both the government's 25 year plan to improve the environment and the UN's 13th Goal to tackle climate change.

As a local authority, we work together to achieve these outcomes.

Our Journey so far

Catering and Cleaning has been committed to climate change and the environment for over 10 years - it wasn't new to us! Our initiatives included:

- Environmental policies both services
- Energy awareness campaign in buildings and school kitchens
- Environmentally friendly chemicals both services (better cleaning)
- Fully compostable disposables all kitchens and commercial catering
- 'Bronze Food for Life' Award
- Micro Fibre Cloths
- Local company in Telford reducing carbon footprint bin Liners made from fully recycled plastic

Cont'd...

- Green Achiever Award 2015 cleaning
- Introduced reusable cup initiative cafes and wider
- Waste oil collected by supplier and recycled into fuel
- Recycling corporate buildings/removing individual bins
- Introducing food waste bins corporate buildings
- We include environmental policies within our procurement process
- Reducing milk cartons in Café Go introducing 24 pint cartons
- Reduction in Clingfilm with a view to remove completely
- All vacuums made in the UK (reducing Carbon Footprint)
- Locally Sourced Suppliers both services
- Energy efficient Dishwashers working in partnership with other council partners





Working with Schools

- All Telford schools have an ECO committee we have worked closely with Hollinswood and Lightmoor Primary as they are the forerunners.
- Both schools contacted us to challenge our environmental commitment
 they had looked at both catering and cleaning in particular.
- From this, meetings were held and they had challenging but relevant questions and views about what have they/we achieved together.
- We explained what we had already got in place and they were pleased that we had already started to make changes.
- Hollinswood has become 'Plastic Free' and was the first school in the county to receive the 'Plastic Free Award'- the panel will be presenting at the West Midlands LACA event.

Cont'd...

- We changed individual fruit and yoghurt pots to decanting the fruit into bowls, and recycled large plastic catering containers for pen collections in council buildings.
- Lightmoor supported the change in recycled bin bags.
- Working to reduce the chemical range enviro concentrates (Jangro)
- We both meet with school councils
- We have both worked with the individual schools to support the return in September trying to maintain the 'keeping it green' message
- This helps retain and gain new contracts as schools like to know what we are and can do to support their Climate Change agenda
