
- 1987 Two Dog Control Officers

#### Draft ASB BILL

Clause 98 Dangerous Dogs

Current penalties stand at two years' imprisonment and/or an unlimited fine for aggravated offences but the changes announced will see the penalties increased to

#### Clause 98, amendment

- (1) The Dangerous Dogs Act 1991 is amended as follows.
- (2) In section 3 (keeping dogs under proper control)—
- (a) in subsection (1)—
- (i) for "a public place" there is substituted "any place in England or Wales (whether or not a public place)";
- (ii) after "injures any person" there is inserted "or assistance dog";

#### Clause 98 Penalties

- 14 years' imprisonment if a person dies as a result of a dog attack,
- 5 years' imprisonment if a person is injured by a dog attack, and
- 3 years' imprisonment if an assistance dog either dies or is injured by a dog attack

#### Clause 98

 In coming to a decision on new maximum penalties for dog attacks, we (DEFRA) have taken into account the responses to the consultation and the need for maximum penalties to be proportionate to the offence. We have also compared the current maximum penalty with the maximum penalties for other offences.

- Staff who are prepared/trained/able to address dog owners and dog issues

- Public Spaces Protection Orders (ASB Bill).
