


### **Central Management Systems**



### CMS – What do they do?




- Wireless remote switching of <u>each individual</u> lighting unit
- Individual or group control for dimming of lighting units
- Energy reporting
- Fault reporting
- Ability to respond to changing energy demands

#### **NEW Street Lighting Toolkit**

- Developed from Scottish Futures Trust by Local Partnerships and DECC
- The new toolkit provides clear guidelines and a structured process for councils to work through to deliver successful energy efficient street lighting initiatives and is endorsed by Amber Rudd MP, Minister for Energy and Climate Change:
  - "This toolkit draws on best practice and learning from local authorities who have already implemented successful energy efficient street lighting schemes, and has been specifically tailored for use in England".
- On an England-wide basis alone, if all local authorities switched to LED street lights, this would save up to £200m on electricity bills annually and deliver carbon savings of around 1MtCO2e each year, which is equivalent to the carbon emissions from 300,000 average cars.



This framework is designed as a guide for all Lighting Professionals at whatever stage of their career and in whatever lighting discipline their career and in whatever upinting disciplin they are working. It is equally applicable to new trainees or senior designers, and for those professionals in sales, manufacturing, design, research or any other lighting related field.

Competency and demonstrating competency are not optional:

• Whatever stage your career has reached from senior management to technician...

• Whatever your age: from graduate trainee

- Whateveryour job function: technical, design, team leadership, business management...
   Whoever your employer: consultancy, contractor, manufacturer or supplier, client...

There are many reasons why it is necessary for you to demonstrate your competency in today's working environment, including

- Assuring clients that you have the necessary abilities to deliver the results they seek, including technical knowledge and skills, contract compliance, satisfying the requirements of standards, health & safety, regulations and CDM
- Convincing employers that you are bestequipped for the role or project: many project now require evidence that staff meet minimu etency requirements before they are awarded or can begin work. "Competent" employees deliver competitive advantage

- CDM 2007 Regulation 4 states: 'Clients must ensure that designers, contractors and other team members that they propose to engage
- Professional Indemnity insurers often require evidence of competency for each employee and the activities they are





#### How do I demonstrate my competency?

Gather evidence in a competency portfolio. Evidence may include

- Skill Level Development Summary
- · CPD records · business/project plans
- · proposals or reviews
- presentations to clients or at conferences.
- specifications
- designs

The first step is to start by defining what, in

your present role, you need to be competent

to do; next identify the knowledge, skills and

attitude that deliver that competence: what level of competence is required; then detail

the evidence you can provide to prove that

managerial and personal skills that you can

identify, all of which help to demonstrate your

- internal memos
- · letters, reports
- minutes of meetings (which demonstrate your contribution)
- · employer assessments for pay and /or promotion reviews
