1. Introduction & Welcome

Cllr George Paul, Chair of the group welcomed all to the meeting. As part of his introduction, George updated the group on the situation in Russia and Sri Lanka on non-hazardous asbestos and encouraged attendees to contact him for information on this

3. Minutes from previous meeting 9 November 2018

The minutes of the meeting on the 9 November 2018 were agreed as a true and accurate account.

4. Matters arising

There were no matters arising from the minutes of the previous meeting.

5. Gas and electricity theft: the importance of revenue protection

As much of the detail of the presentation is very sensitive, the notes on the contents of the presentation are deliberately vague. Alan Neill and Stuart Miller from Scottish Power provided an overview of the work of their department in detecting and preventing energy theft. Energy theft is dangerous and can lead to personal injury, damage to property and risk to lives. The team carried out 27,000 visits in 2018 with around 30% irregularity/interference at accessed properties. The presentation also featured a show and tell of tampered meters, common frauds and other things to look out for.

6. West Lothian's assisted decorating scheme

Robert Smith and Richard Green from West Lothian Council attended the meeting to provide a background on the Council's Assisted Decoration Scheme. The scheme was introduced in 2015/16 to contribute to improved health and wellbeing of the tenants and to improve tenancy sustainment. The qualifying criteria for the project is to be either for older people of pensionable age or households of singular or multiple people of reduced physical capacity. 1254 households out of 1327 applicants have benefitted from the scheme to date. The scheme has proven to be extremely popular with tenants and the customer feedback from questionnaires is showing 99.5% satisfaction.

The scheme includes: preparation of the room (i.e. stripping, filling, lining paper), painting of walls, ceilings and woodwork and/or wallpapering, tenants can choose from a wallpaper pattern book supplied by WLC at no cost or choose to provide their own at their expense, choice of paint colours, assistance can be given to clearing out the room prior to work commencing.

The scheme provides workloads throughout the year for their in-house resource, there is high interest from operatives to be involved in the programme, and it has been well received from employees.

Training opportunities include developing skills of their own in-house resource, a schools programme (multi-trade programmes, girls into construction), work experience, International Student placements and Modern & Adult apprenticeships.

7. Advisory group areas and future focus / work plan 2019/2020

A number of future advisory group areas of future focus were suggested including: New alarm regulations, home insultation, tower safety, certification for double fire doors, certifications, new build and off-site construction, internal property renovations, open market acquisition schemes, design and build and others. These were noted by the APSE office for consideration in the preparation of future agendas.

Garry Lee provided an update on the current work of the Association, including the latest briefings, publications, recent advocacy work, network queries, upcoming APSE Energy and APSE Training events in Scotland, the work of APSE Solutions and upcoming Scottish and National seminars.
