3. Combined Heat and Power: District Heating System

Speaker: Ian Booth, General Manager, Aberdeen Heat and Power

lan provided a very interesting and informative to the group on the district heating systems being used in Aberdeen. The presentation included information on how and why the not for profit organisation, Combined Heat & Power was established in 2002.

The presentation also provided information on how the organisation operates and is funded as well as showing the group a number of developments they have worked on to date. Concluding with some results to date and areas of interest for the future.

Following the presentation there was a number of questions from the floor which included:-

Did the systems have heat meters controlling usage? Ian informed the group that after Council consultation with residents, the residents had decided to opt for the heat with rent option.

What was the rough cost per week for the heating system? Ian and representatives from Aberdeen City Council confirmed that for a 2 bed flat it was approx £10/£15.

4. <u>Street Lighting = Energy Efficiency: Scottish Futures Trust Pilot</u>

<u>Speakers: Jack McAulay, Roads Manager, West Dunbartonshire Council & Morag Wallace, Associate Director, Scottish Futures Trust</u>

Both Jack & Morag again provided an excellent presentation on the current street lighting pilot which West Dunbartonshire Council were involved in. Morag updated the group on the drivers for the need to invest including political and organisational and what the Scottish Futures Trust's role was in the low carbon investment.

Jack McAulay then went on to talk about West Dunbartonshire's involvement in the pilot itself including the business case for the pilot and how the savings would be achieved..

5. Solar Panel Project: Dumfries and Galloway Council

<u>Speaker: Chris Wood-Gee, Team Leader Sustainable Development, Dumfries & Galloway Council</u>

The final enlightening and interesting presentation to the group was given by Chris Wood-Gee of Dumfries & Galloway Council. Chris spoke about the Councils Carbon Management Plan and highlighted the energy consumption/ cost trends over the past 10 years. He also informed the

group of the Council's choice for solar PV to provide part of the solution to energy reduction. Chris provided the group with some useful tips on areas to help find advice on this form of solution as well as the considerations the Council had to think about during the process including registering a site and paying for the investment. Concluding the presentation with achievement to date.

Following the presentation questions from the floor included?

Does the Council use any ground mounted solar panels? Not doing anything yet, but looking into this as a possible future option.
