About the venue

St George's Hall is a unique and popular conference venue.

Widely regarded as one of the finest neo-classical buildings in the world St George's Hall is a Grade I listed building. It was reopened in 2007 by Prince Charles after a £23m refurbishment programme.

Built in the early 1800s as a space for music festivals and the Civil and Crown courts, the hall has always been at the heart of community life in the city.

Over 25,000 people gathered outside the Hall when John Lennon was killed, and in excess of 65,000 witnessed Liverpool's spectacular European Capital of Culture People's Opening in 2008.

Today the venue host exhibitions, tours and talks, corporate events and weddings both large and small in a selection of beautiful rooms.

St George's Hall is easily accessed from across APSE northern region local authorities by road, rail and public transport and is located directly opposite Liverpool Lime Street Station. Although there is not parking available on-site at St George's Hall there is ample public car parking available in Liverpool City Centre.
