

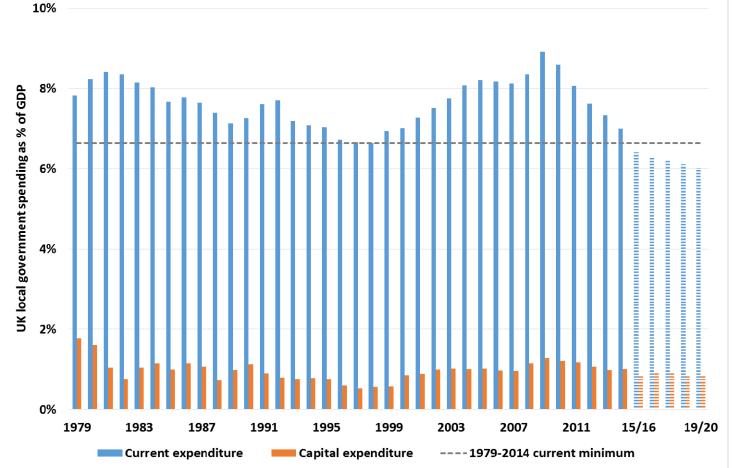

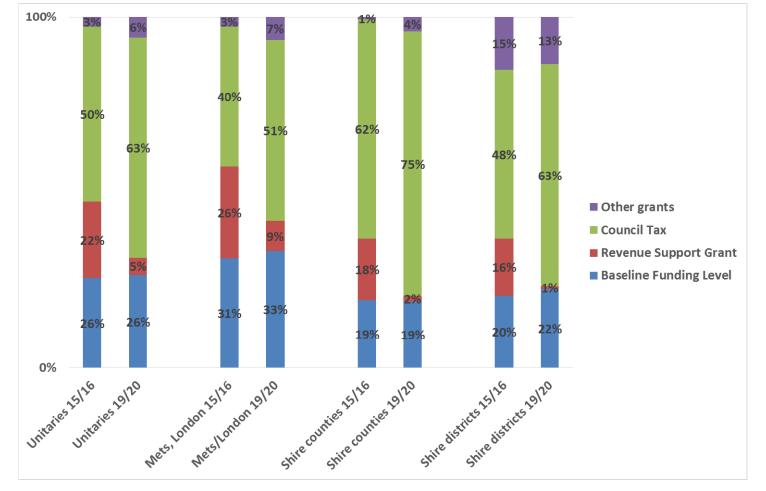
UK local government spending as a share of GDP: current spending, already below the 1979-2014 minimum, is projected to go on falling to 2020

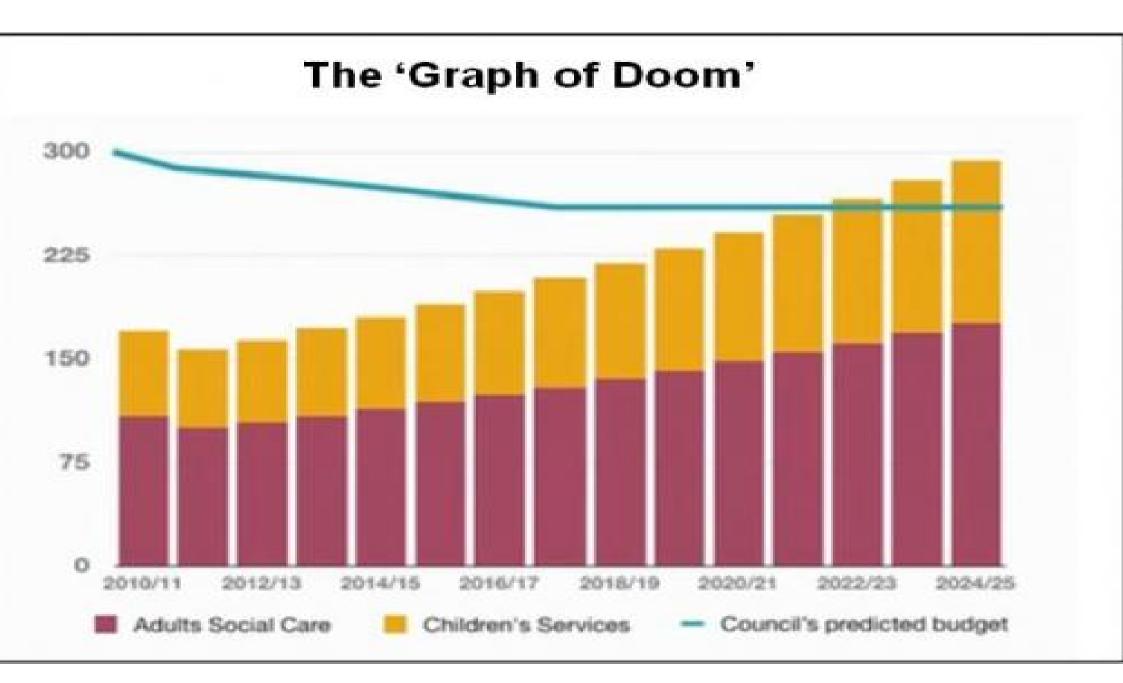




Balance of core spending power 15/16 and 19/20: as RSG shrivels beyond London and the Mets, most LA funding will come from council tax



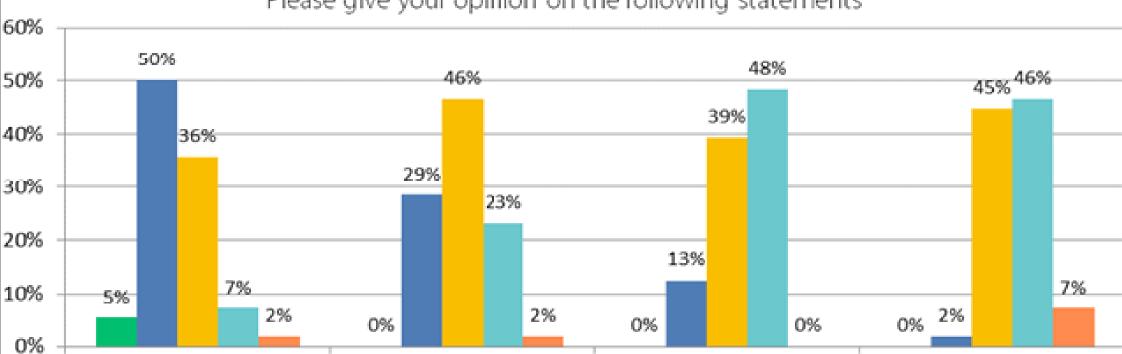

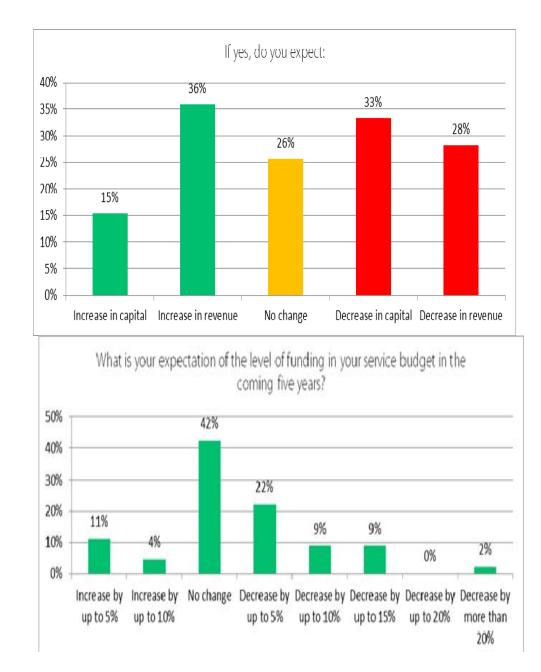


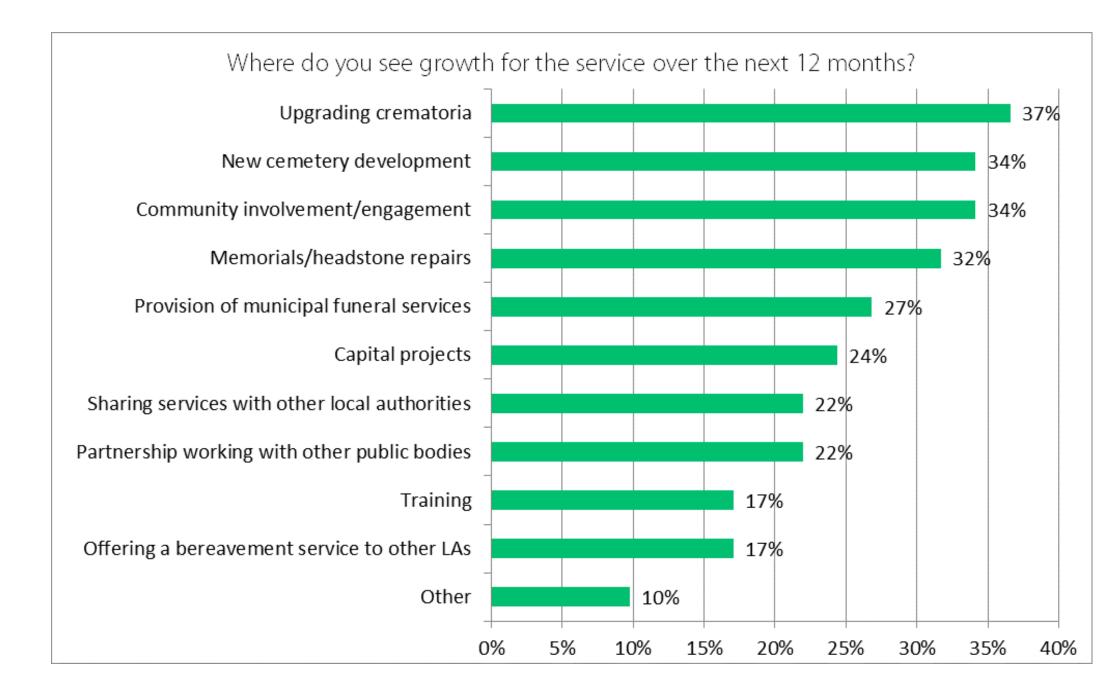
What environmental issues are a priority for your cemeteries and crematoria?



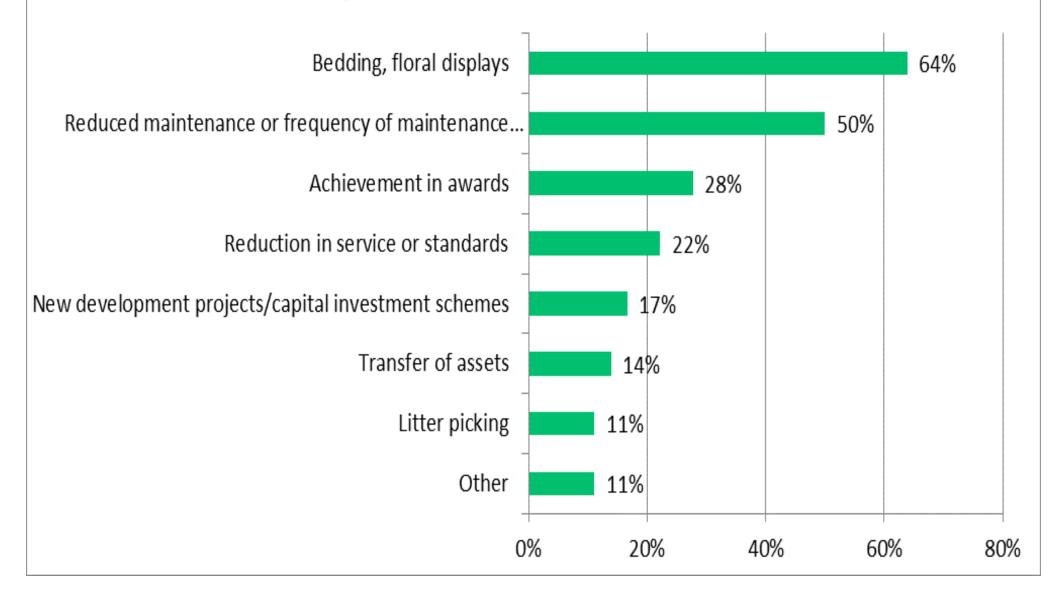

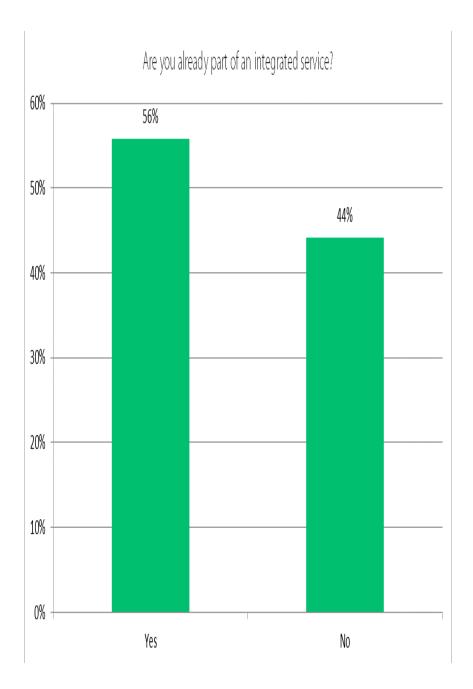




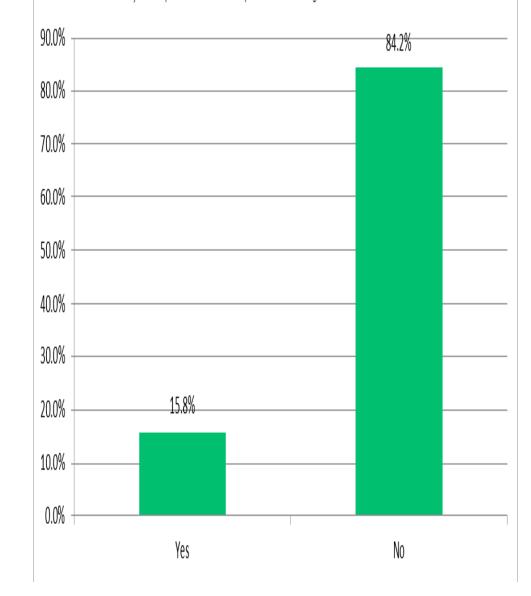


Where do you see future decreases in work for the service?

Key findings: Trust and taxes remain high

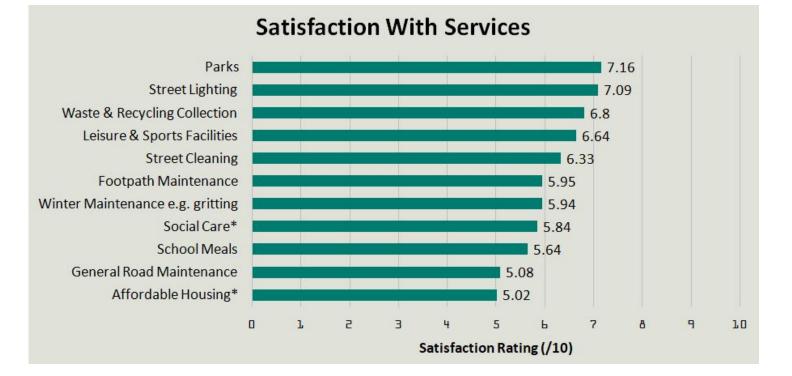
As in 2016, Trust in Councils and Councillors high versus Government ministers and Private Companies.

- Five times as many still trust the local Council over the Government to make decisions about how services are delivered provided in your local area
- Eight times as many trust local councillors over government ministers to make decision about their local area
- Five and half times as many trusted council to provide services in their local area over a private company with people trusting the council 7.5 times more than the government.
- 79% would like the government to give more money to local councils to spend at the local level for services that are their neighbourhood.



Performance of Councils services positive

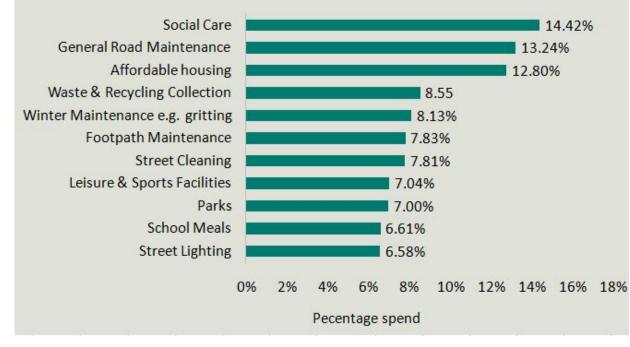




How the public would like extra funds spent



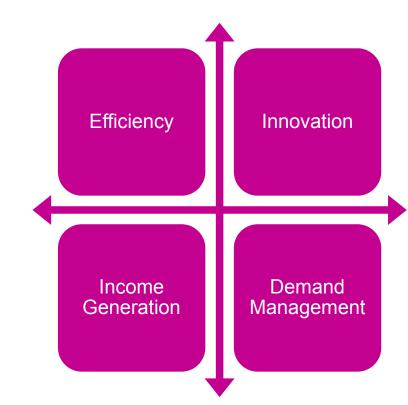
What percentage of the extra money would be spent on each of the 11 services below?



What will local government look like in 2020?



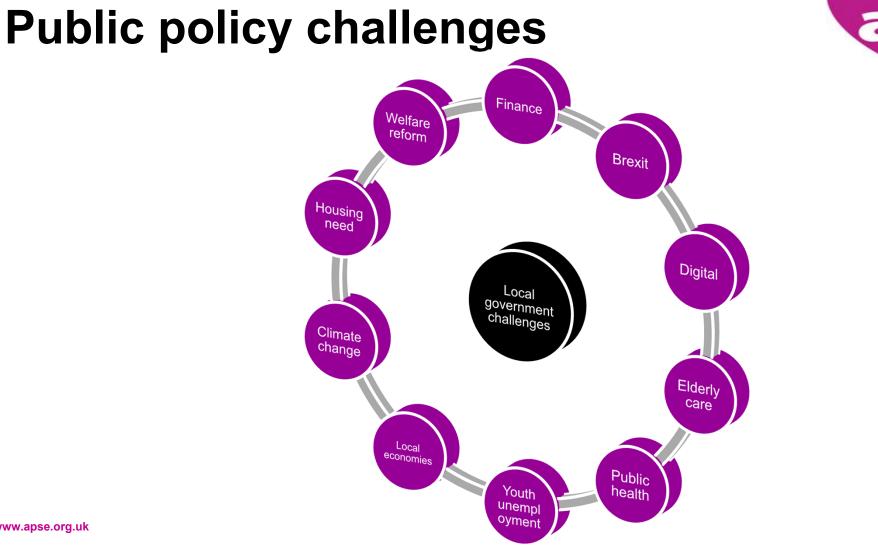








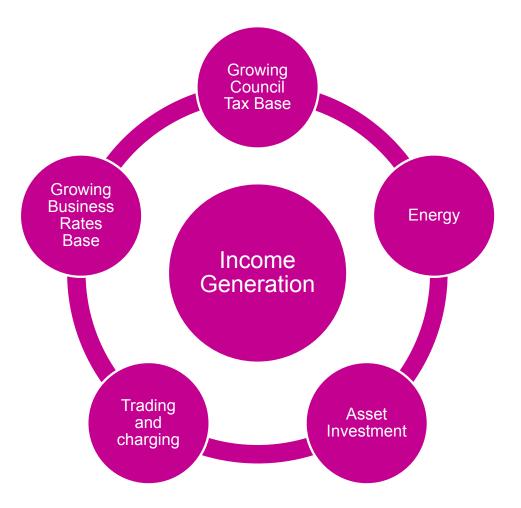

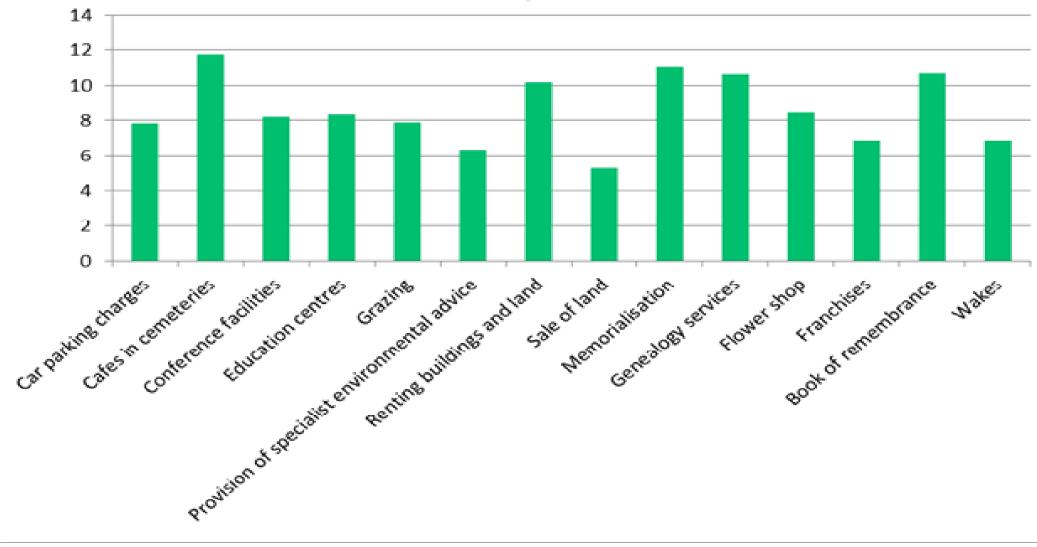


How do you expect to achieve any efficiencies required (eg Increase income level / introducing new services offers)

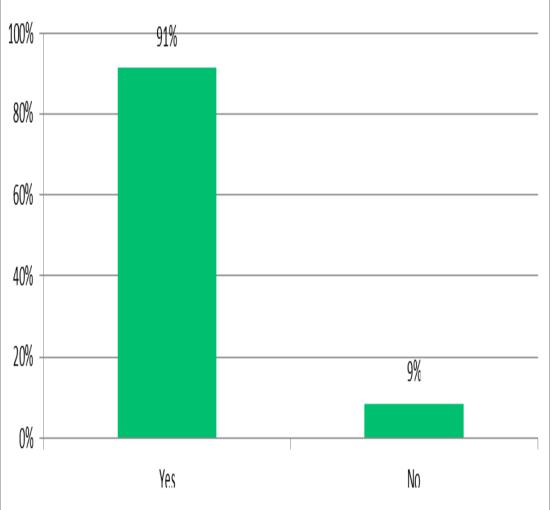
- Increase existing fees & charges
- Charging differential rates e.g. for non-residents
- additional fee for pre-purchase
- Charge for products previously free
- Introducing new and increased memorial offer and memorial mason services
- Utilising unused cemetery land to develop burial vaults, sarcophagi and mausoleum plots. This has led to increased revenue, burial provision and choice for local families.
- Creation of new woodland burial service and reviewing fees and charges by benchmarking the market.
- Letting-out vacant cemetery buildings
- Full cost recovery dependent upon political agreement.
- Better utilisation of current facilities, including expanding into the undertaker/funeral Director side.
- Introduction of pet cemetery
- Attempt to increase income levels through the provision of new services such as Municipal Funeral Service.
- Introducing new service with additional fees (e.g. Saturday service provision).
- Use of heat exchange to reduce heating/energy bills.
- Using the ceremony rooms for other things other than funerals (outside funeral service times).



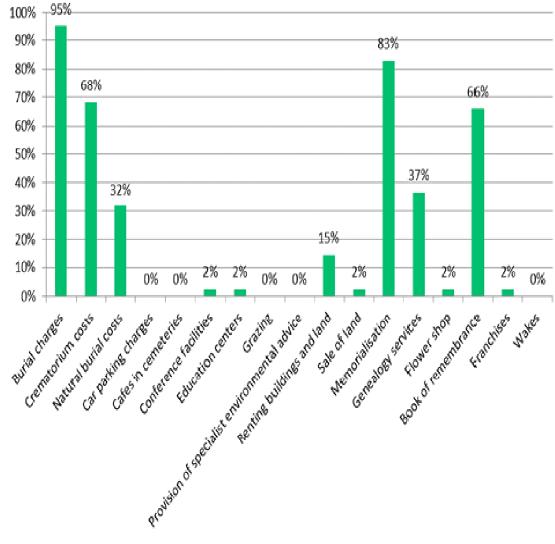
Apart from burial and crematorium charges, what other areas do you currently generate income in through fees and charges (either provided inhouse of through a franchise)?



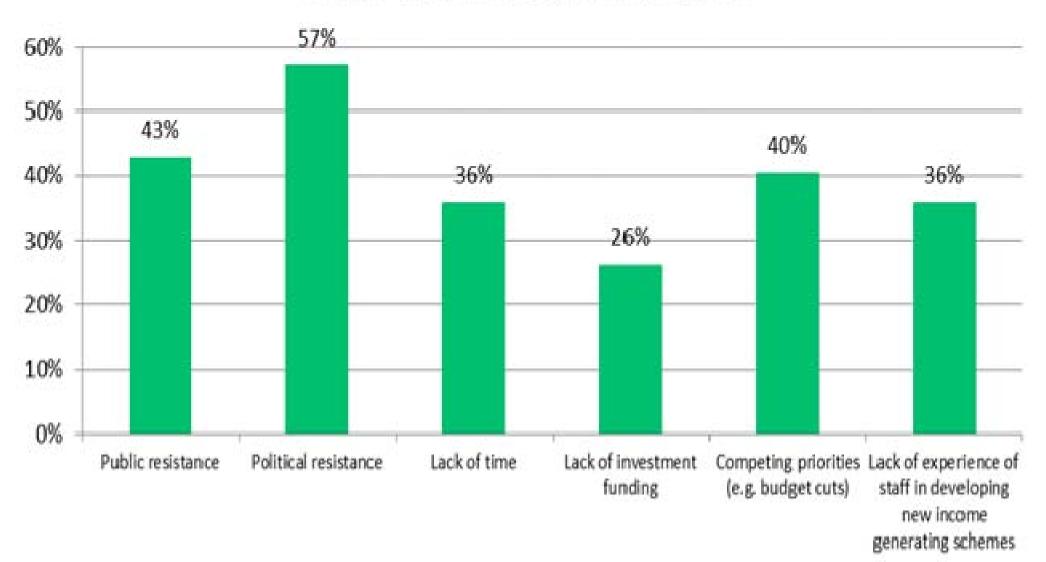
Are you intending to increase fees and charges over the next 2-3 years to meet efficiency pressures?

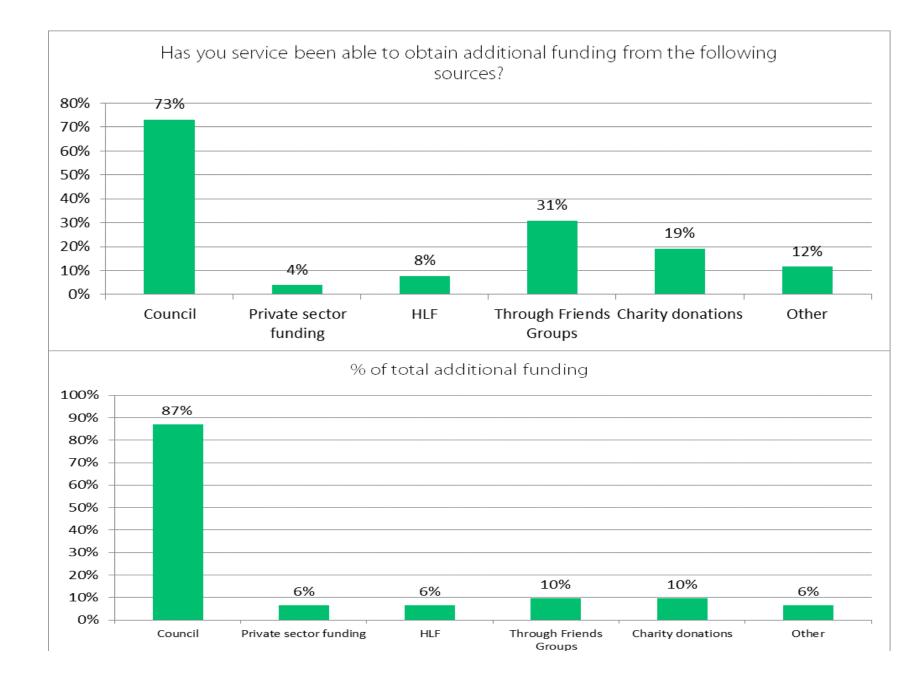


If yes, what areas do you intend to increase fees and charges in over the next 2-3 years?
