

## MANCHESTER: A CERTAIN FUTURE

#### one

To reduce the city of Manchester's emissions of CO<sup>2</sup> by **41% by 2020**, from 2005 levels. This equates to a reduction from current levels of 3.2 million tonnes per annum to less than two million; it also equates to a reduction in per capita emissions from 7.3 tonnes to 4.3 tonnes per head.

#### two

To engage all individuals, neighbourhoods and organisations in Manchester in a process of **cultural change** that embeds 'low-carbon thinking' into the lifestyles and operations of the city.




Figure 7: A consumption-based 'total carbon footprint' for Greater Manchester. The greenhouse gas footprint of Greater Manchester residents broken down by consumption category (A total including 'embedded' emissions of 41.2 million tonnes CO<sub>2</sub>e compared to 18.0 million tonnes of 'direct' emissions).

The plan outlines four headline visions for Greater Manchester by 2020:

- A rapid transition to a low carbon economy
- Collective carbon emissions reduced by 48%
- Be prepared for and actively adapting to a rapidly changing climate
- 'Carbon Literacy' will have become embedded into the culture of organisations, lifestyles and behaviours




