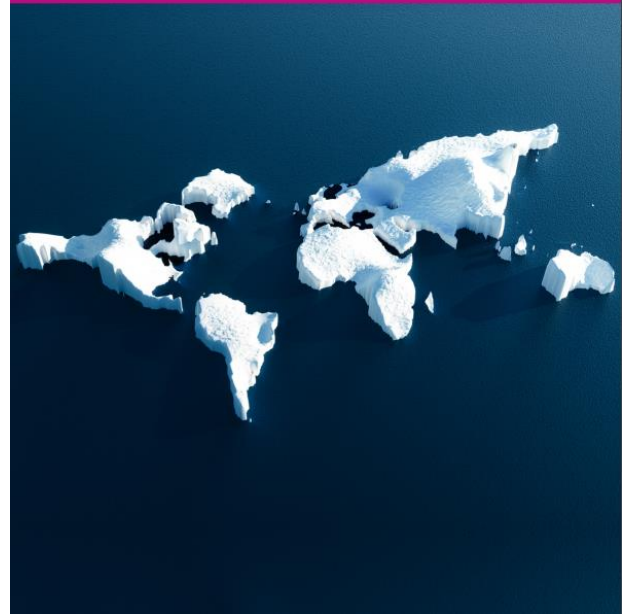
## Local Authority Climate Emergency Declarations

# Research

## Neighbourhood services and sustainable local government

We find that over the nine years from 2009/10 resources devoted to neighbourhood services across Britain fell 27 per cent representing a total of £8.9bn in 2017/18 prices. This is against the background of a real fall in total UK local government spending over the same period of 19 per cent demonstrating that neighbourhood services have taken a bigger share of austerity than other council services.

## Rebuilding Capacity: The case for insourcing public contracts

This research explores the growing phenomenon of 'Insourcing'; bringing back 'in-house' the delivery of services. It takes a focus on UK local government services and questions the drivers for this increase in insourcing. It finds that insourcing is not a passive reaction to contract failures but is increasingly viewed as a proactive response to the public policy pressures facing local councils, not least the ongoing impact of austerity.
