# Developing a partnership approach to create a reflective fitting area for Veterans.

St Helens Council have a very successful Friends group – Established in 2005

This partnership has been fostered for over many years.

The group have a signed constitution, the Management Committee meet on a regular basis with the Council to discuss new ideas and initiatives.

They are well respected within the local Community and beyond by visitors and other groups. They have worked with the local Veterans and other groups like the sea cadets, the British legion and other military voluntary groups.



- During the WW1 (2014-18) Anniversary celebrations, the group funded a small Memorial and had a ceremony and parade.
- The Council also placed a Tommy Memorial in the Cemetery following being approached by the Friends Group.
- From 2014 every year the Friends Group worked in partnership with the local veterans to place a poppy tribute on every soldier's
  grave within St Helens Cemetery. The Bereavement Services Team supported them with this.
- A Member of the Friends Group is now also a CWGC volunteer and carries out annual CWGC walks around the grounds.
- The Friends Group also carry out heritage and soldier walks around the grounds they have taken groups of sea cadets, schools, etc on tours of the grounds also.
- During Summer 2019 met with the Veterans group and the Friends Group and agreed that they could do general cleaning up and basic maintenance in the grounds together every Friday.
- Therefore, the small group met every Friday morning with a phase of pause during the pandemic and during this time the Armed Forces Memorial Garden idea was born.
