What is a Combined Authority?

Established by Order of Secretary of State

Covers two or more Local Authority areas

conditions

Functions may include

- Transport
- Economic Development and Regeneration
 - function to be exercisable instead of or concurrently with the Local Authority
 - with a view to promoting the economic development and regeneration of the area
 - Funded by Local Authorities
- General Power



Orders so far

Barnsley, Doncaster, Rotherham and Sheffield Combined Authority

Durham, Gateshead, Newcastle Upon Tyne, North Tyneside, Northumberland, South Tyneside and Sunderland Combined Authority

Greater Manchester Combined Authority

Halton, Knowsley, Liverpool, St Helens, Sefton and Wirral Combined Authority

West Yorkshire Combined Authority



How is it different to a Joint Service/Committee?

- Body Corporate
 - Separate Legal Entity
 - Employ own staff
 - Enter into own contracts
- Separate Governance

- Not separate entity
- Localism Act
 - Power to transfer functions of public body to a LA



Working with CCGs (and the rest of the NHS)

- Supply of goods and services
 - CCGs, NHS England and Special Health Authorities are eligible customers under 1970 Act
- Section 75 Arrangements
 - Funding
 - Partnership working
 - Local Authority and NHS Body
- Joint Committees
- Care Trust
- Power to make payments
