





□ General Safety Regulations – ADAS

□Vehicle Usage – Alternative fuels

□Bridge Incidents

□ Fatigue

(GSR)



- Implemented through vehicle and component 'type approval'
- Introduces 'safety measures'
- Measures that directly support driver called ADAS
- Mandatory from 7 July for:
 - New vehicles
 - New types

The Guide To Maintaining Roadworthiness

• 'The driver is always responsible for the safe operation of any vehicle under their control. It is therefore essential that staff are adequately trained to confirm that any ADAS fitted is functioning correctly and that faults highlighted are rectified before a vehicle is used on the highway.' The Guide To Maintaining Roadworthiness

• 'It should be remembered that a correctly functioning ADAS is designed to support a driver, not replace them.'

ADAS driver checks

- Various sensors and cameras
- Mostly self-checking
- Faults displayed on dashboard

ADAS maintenance

- Support safety critical systems
- Effective maintenance procedures
 essential
- It is **vital** that ADAS work is carried out by a competent person



LOGISTICS UK

ADAS maintenance

- Maintenance should be fully documented
- Cameras and sensor calibration should be checked:
 - Windscreen replacement
 - ADAS device fault
 - Engine control unit fault
 - Wheel alignment
 - Mechanical or body repair affecting geometry

Switching off ADAS

- Systems allow deactivation
- Most reset automatically
- Guide to Maintaining Roadworthiness says:
 - 'Operators should have a documented policy on action to be taken if the ADAS system is defective or is deactivated.'



Vehicle Usage

Application	Requirements for Category B licence holder
Operator Licence	 Exempt if all of the following apply: Powered entirely by alternative fuels, MAM not exceeding 4.25t, Operated within Great Britain.
Drivers' hours and tachograph	Exempt if used with 100km radius of base of undertaking.
Trailers	No trailer allowed. Higher licence entitlements are not affected.
Testing	Exempt if electrically powered and registered before 1 March 2015. If under or up to 3.5t MAM, then on third anniversary of registration. If over 3.5t MAM, then on first anniversary of registration.
Driver CPC	If using Category B licence, then not required. If using Category C1 or above, then Driver CPC is required.
Training	Five hours of training by an instructor registered on either:National Register of LGV Instructors.National Vocational Driving Instructors Register.

Fatigue – accident statistics


10 to 20% accidents are fatigue related

4 in 10 involve commercial vehicles


1 in 8 fallen asleep at the wheel




Fatigue – microsleeps

What are they?


- Lasts between 2 and 30 seconds

1 in 3 admitted to experiencing them


