

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Social Housing Net Zero Standard: Consultation Update



Consultation Proposals Overview

- Introduction of a new Fabric Efficiency Rating (FER), measured in kWh/m²/year.
- A Minimum Energy Efficiency Standard (MEES), aligned to a list of measures, to be met before properties can be re-let
- Suggests grounds for temporary exemptions for properties unable to meet the MEES by the cutoff date
- Requirements to install a clean heating system by 2045, with suggested interim targets
- Proposals to apply the SHNZS to mixed tenure properties and public sector Gypsy/Traveller sites
- Requirements for a ventilation and monitoring strategy where mechanical ventilation is not installed
- A proposed timeline for implementation of the SHNZS

Social Housing Net Zero Standard: Next Steps

Consultation Update

- Following the work of EESS2 Review Group, the Scottish Government ran <u>a public consultation on a</u> proposed new Social Housing Net Zero Standard (SHNZS) for Scotland between 28 November 2023 and 8 March 2024.
- The consultation received 114 responses: 95 from organisations and 19 from individuals. Responses have been published where permission has been granted.
- Responses to the consultation were analysed by an independent organisation, whose final report is to be published in due course
- A final meeting of the EESSH2 Review Group has been scheduled to review the analysis and discuss final proposals for the Standard to be put to Ministers ahead of SHR consultation

Next Steps for SHNZS

- Meeting with EESSH2 Review Group to discuss proposals Scheduled for **March 2025**.
- Publish consultation analysis
- Government response detailing proposed measures
- Proposals and technical guidance submitted to Scottish Housing Regulator (SHR)
- SHR consultation on charter indicators for the new SHNZS.
- First reporting year (TBC) following SHR consultation.

Social Housing Net Zero Standard: In the meantime...

Interim Guidance

- Social landlords should continue to invest in energy efficiency measures to help reduce running costs, and in zero direct emissions heating systems where appropriate
- This will prevent lock-in of poor performance and reduce the risk of additional issues arising in future
- Registered Social Landlords (RSLs) and local authorities should continue to draw on support available for example through the Social Housing Net Zero Heat Fund

Progress continues in the social rented sector

- The latest SHCS figures published this week:
 - 69% of SRS at EPC C or better
 - Wall and loft insulation levels have increased
 - o SHQS failure rate has decreased
