The Public Sector - The Financial Risks

- As of March 2025, six UK councils are effectively bankrupt or in special measures (Section 114 notices).
- Over 40% of councils in England are at risk of financial failure over the next five years.
- The single overarching risk currently faced by the UK local government sector is financial unsustainability, jeopardising statutory services and overall community wellbeing.

The Public Sector – 'Toxic Culture'

The Post Office pursued prosecutions against sub-postmasters based on faulty Horizon data, leading to over 900 convictions between 1999 and 2015.

The failure to provide crucial relevant disclosure in court cases undermined the criminal justice system and public confidence in it.

Inadequate financial controls, poor recordkeeping, a lack of proper oversight in the Post Office's management of the Horizon system.
