Industrial Strategy












 - 2018 guidance unchanged apart from tyre management




















- Prove you are an exemplary operator
- Less likely to have your vehicles stopped
- Use the DVSA Earned Recognition marque
- Dedicated contact in DVSA for earned recognition
- What are we looking at next? A number of potential benefits have been suggested, which includes:-
 - MOT testing, delegated testing, domestic use exemptions, ATF resources & approvals
 - Review non-culpable prohibition and immobilisation action for ER operators
 - Alignment of standards for specifier requirements (sections 10 & 11)
 - OTC fast-track -
 - Insurance discounts Ongoing discussions with British Insurance Association





New sections 10 and 11

- Working with HS2 and TFL we are seeking to implement optional audit modules which will meet specifier requirements
- The draft sections are currently going through stakeholder review

Counter Terrorism (CT)

DfT have asked us to include CT standards into the generic ER audit standards, we
acknowledge this is very important, so we have drafted the CT standards and will look at
introducing in the near future

Inclusive Transport Leaders Scheme (ITLS)

 DfT have approached us to see how ITLS and be incorporated into PSV ER, we have had initial discussions the next steps are to discuss with stakeholders and ITLS pilot operators.

Earned Recognition means they have earned recognition for their compliance!





