### Procurement law changes



- Implements the EU Public Procurement Directive 2014/24
- UK wide applicability (except Scotland)
- In force since 26<sup>th</sup> February 2015
- Applies to all new procurements from that date



- Which services are covered?
  - Parts A and B abolished
  - All services are subject to the regime unless expressly excluded in Schedule 3
  - Schedule 3 services are subject to a 'light touch regime'
  - Reserving certain contracts to staff mutuals



- Thresholds for applicability
  - £172,514 for all sub central contracting authorities unless services are in Schedule 3
  - £625,050 for Schedule 3 services
- Contract Award criteria
  - Lowest Price abandoned
  - MEAT only applies



- Toolbox approach to procedures
  - Open Procedure
  - Restricted Procedure
  - Competitive Procedure with Negotiation
  - Competitive Dialogue
  - the Innovation Partnership



- Better access to market for SMEs and Start-ups
  - Simplification of information obligations
  - Division into lots
  - Limitations on participation



- Help for SMEs Lord Young's reforms
  - Below threshold PQQs abolished
  - Above threshold PQQs standardised
  - All public sector contracts to be advertised on Contracts Finder
  - 30 day payment terms in all public contracts and sub contracts

## Making changes in Leisure Trust contracts



#### Limitations on change (Pressetext)

- Introduce conditions that, had they been part of the initial award procedure, would have allowed for the:
  - admission of tenderers other than those initially admitted; or
  - acceptance of a tender other than the one initially accepted.
- Extends the scope of the contract considerably to encompass services not initially covered.
- Changes the economic balance in favour of the contractor in a manner that was not provided for in the terms of the initial contract.

## Nine things to look out for in 2015



- Shared parental leave and pay begins
- Changes to statutory adoption leave and pay
- New right to take time off to attend adoption appointments
- Child's age limit for parental leave raises to 18
- Cap on holiday pay calculation
- Removal of defined-contribution pension schemes restrictions
- Statutory maternity, ordinary paternity and adoption pay rises
- Statutory sick pay increases
- General Election Political Parties Manifestos



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
