## A different approach to the issue

King George's Playing Fields - Romford



- Site Popular with footballers
- Low income and management issues
- Percentage of the site was leased
- Technically a disposal
- Tender was awarded to Play Football
- 11 3G pitches were constructed Their investment
- 5 a-side and 7 a-side and a social area/bar
- Council receives rent in excess of £90k per year
- Site is popular with footballers
- Football played all year round and until 10pm

Bedfords Park Walled Garden



- Grant aided (several Big Food, Big Lottery, Veolia) External company (Clear Village) developed an old walled garden into an organic educational growing area.
- Community volunteers
- Income from events and sale of produce
- Training in growing and plant husbandry techniques
- Low production costs volunteers
- Low running costs eco technology
- Site to be handed over to the public in the next 5 years

- Continuation of current trends will result in Greens being closed as clubs cannot pay charges.
