# Background: Roath, Cardiff

- Densely populated, large student population, but also a number of young professionals
- Culturally diverse, multiple languages
- Incorrect presentation of household waste/Waste storage issues
- Litter bins where historically required
- Rounds based on historical data
- High volume of café's and bars
- Insufficient cleansing resource





### 'Roath is Rubbish'

- Community visioning events organised by the Cynefin Cardiff Programme: litter was high on the agenda
- Group gathered data on litter bin distribution
- Facebook page 'Roath is Rubbish' created
- Press "I think it's just through sheer laziness what's happening, no-one's really looking at this, and nobody cares enough. The people in the community care".
- 100 followers contacted council (more bins please!)





### **Action Plan**


- Site visit to review litter bins and waste issues
- Consider re-brand
- Group to contact local businesses for support.
- Council to help identify funding for resources such as hi-vis, litter pickers and stickers to promote the brand
- Council to review cleansing schedules
- Launch new brand and new bins in the summer.






# Rebranding

- T-shirts, stickers, hi-vis, murals





# The launch – 19<sup>th</sup> September 2015

- Badge making
- Upcycling
- Council officer outreach
- Cleansing teams in the area
- Murals
- Litter pick
- Ribbon cutting of 10 new bins
- Promoted community meeting










### Since the Launch

- Picks every Saturday 25% recycled
- 1157 bags of litter collected in 2017
- Installation of 3 planters and hanging baskets
- Fully constituted elected committee of 9, enables funding, insurance etc.
- Keep Wales Tidy Winners -Cleaner Communities Awards
- 633 likes on Facebook

### Since the Launch

Hi folks!

- Shortlisted for LARAC 2016 Best Partnership
- Engaging with local schools
- Considered best practice shared with other 'Tidy' groups at quarterly meetings
- Supporting other groups that are emerging
- Limited Council support continues e.g. leaflets for community gardening project
- Rounds amended to ensure litter bins emptied at better times/days
- Introduction of afternoon and evening team focussed on district centres



### Other Activities

- Community Development Coordinator now supports these sorts of groups and activities
- Introduction of planters being expanded 43 city wide to date
- Working with 19 'Keep Tidy' groups
- Over 4,000 volunteer hours city wide April –
   September 2017 = 720 litter picks
- New Love Where You Live badge for Scouts and Guides
- Sources of funding e-mailed to groups and shared on website





# Summary

- Social Media got the wider community involved
- Social media is not enough on its own
- Listen: be open to new ideas
- Explain: Be honest about what you can achieve and when
- Support groups to become established and sustainable
- Help them to help you lobbying businesses and residents.
