Action before or at launch of Strategy

- Increased FPN for littering and flytipping;
- National Campaign "Dirty Little Secret";
- Introduced a charge on single use carrier bags
- Created powers for other organisations to issue FPN
- New powers for SEPA and Revenue Scotland
- Requirement for offenders to provide name and address
- Clarify powers around bin placement to reduce accidental littering

Intervention 1: Communication

Creating and using better data

Public perceptions and concerns about litter:
 Research available on ZWS website

Developing new approaches

 <u>Targeted messaging approach</u>: Toolkit available on ZWS website and currently being expanded



Intervention 2: Education

Creating and using better data

 Engaged with over 70 education professionals and Young Scot "Generation Change" project

Developing new approaches

 Procurement underway to explore integrating litter as a topic into Curriculum in secondary schools



Intervention 3: Local Community Action

Creating and using better data

 Community Litter Prevention Options: with research available on ZWS website

Encouraging new collaboration

 Funded <u>Clean Up Scotland</u>: total of £750,000 delivered by Keep Scotland Beautiful



Intervention 4: Opportunities for Recycling

Creating and using better data

Deposit Return Feasibility Study: with research available on ZWS website

Developing new approaches

 Funding the installation of 4254 Recycling on the Go bins across a range of stakeholders



Intervention 5 & 6: Product & Service Design

Encouraging new collaboration

 Piloting creation of Litter Prevention Action Plans and Community Litter Prevention Action Plans in Dundee

Creating and using better data

 Edinburgh Council using bin sensors to monitor bin fill rates to inform service efficiency



Intervention 7: Guidance Review

Developing new approaches

 Commitment by Scottish Government to lay a new <u>Code of Practice on Litter & Refuse</u>

Encouraging new collaboration

 Formed a Litter Managers Network: as a subgroup of <u>APSE Parks</u>, <u>Grounds</u>, <u>Streets Services</u> <u>Advisory Group</u>



Intervention 8: Future Funding & Support

Developing new approaches

 Zero Waste Scotland funding will be dependent on demonstrating a commitment to litter and flytipping prevention

Encouraging new collaboration

 Litter & Flytipping Programme Team will be working with a broad range of stakeholders to encourage joint-working



Intervention 9: Research & Monitoring

Creating and using better data

 Developing new monitoring methodology: as presented at <u>APSE Performance Network Seminar</u>

Developing new approaches

 Currently tendering to develop a new monitoring system (to support methodology) in next financial year



Intervention 10: Flytipping

Creating and using better data

 Developed <u>FlyMapper</u>: with 24 LA now registered on the system

Encouraging new collaboration

 Flytipping Prevention Group: 6 x LA in South West of Scotland working with FlyMapper data and testing new interventions



Intervention 10: Strengthen the enforcement system

Developing new approaches

 Working with Community Safety Glasgow to improve FPN payment rates

Encouraging new collaboration

 Engaging with all partners in the enforcement chain to look at streamlining process and tackling specific issues e.g. under 16 enforcement



Intervention 10: Enforcement staff training

Developing new approaches

 Developing an employers guide to content: how can enforcement support prevention

Encouraging new collaboration

 Developing a new litter prevention leadership training programme in 17/18. Working with partners to deliver, accredit etc.



Where are we now?

- Scottish Government has invested significantly in supporting strategy delivery
- Research and tools are providing a robustness in evidence and data for future action
- Our programme is now much more externally focused: helping to develop new approaches and new collaboration



What next?

- Solid foundations have been established to help make a significant impact on litter and flytipping
- New Code of Practice and monitoring system have potential to be "game changers"
- ZWS will expand the support and resources available to stakeholders, helping shift focus to prevention and encourage new collaborations
