DEATH OF MR. JOHN ROGERS

Mr. John Rogers, chairman of John Rogers (Limited), boat-builders, &c., Cardiff, died at his residence at Plymouth yesterday after a long illness. Mr. Rogers, who was about 50 years of age, was born in Mount Stuart-square, Cardiff. His father built the first two houses in that thoroughfare. He built a large number of boats for foreign service, and many for the British Navy, particularly during the time the late Sir Edward Reed was the chief-constructor. He established the very successful business at Cardiff now carried on under the style of John Rogers (Limited), and during the late Boer War was busily engaged in the fitting of transports for the conveyance of men, horses, &c., to South Africa. Some three or four years ago he went to Plymouth, and started an independent business as a maker of racing yachts, Government small boats, &c., in which direction he had special gifts.
