 Recycling rates are amongst highest in the country – South 63%, Vale 62%


Car Ownership

 88.4% of households have at least one car in South (86.9% Vale) - amongst the highest in the country

Mr Vale's life expectancy is **81.6** years, Mrs Vale **84.6**, Mr South 81.7 and Mrs South 84.7

Mr and Mrs Vale earn £679 a week full time, Mr and Mrs South £699



They are employed in scientific, technical and professional employment (higher than South East average)

They are **qualified to NVQ4** (Higher apprenticeship, Higher Diploma etc.) or above (higher than both the south east and the UK)



Their homes are **owner** occupied, detached properties



Mr and Mrs Vale's children are 69.6% likely to achieve Grade C/Level 4 or above in GCSE Math and English, Mr and Mrs South's are **71.4%** likely

- South aspirations adopted by Council in October:


Carbon Neutral Council by 2025 Carbon Neutral District by 2030

Embedding climate considerations into policies and procedures


