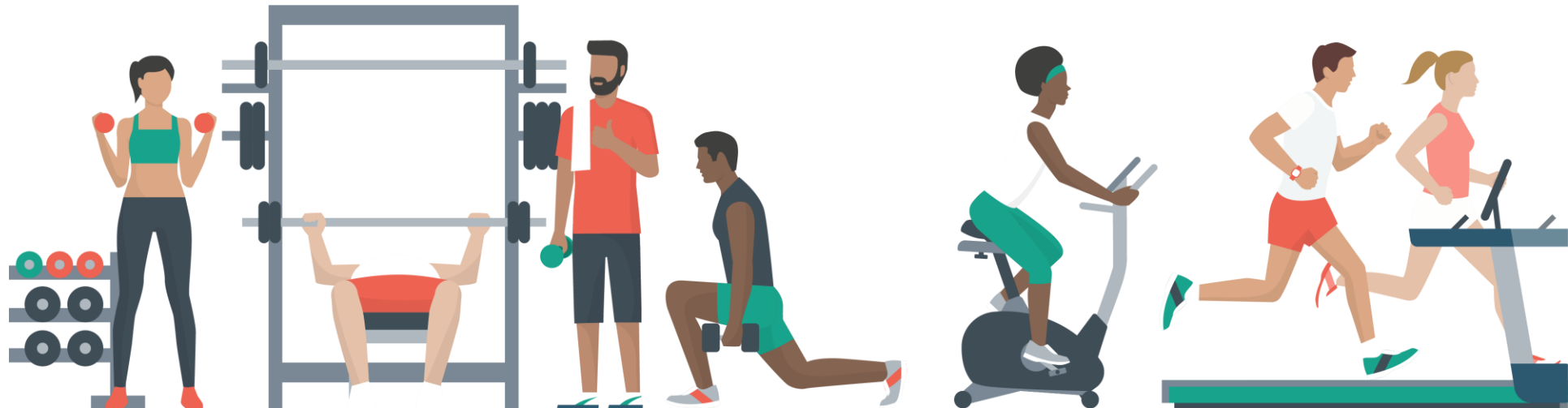

EXCLUSIVE: Government to launch full reorganisation

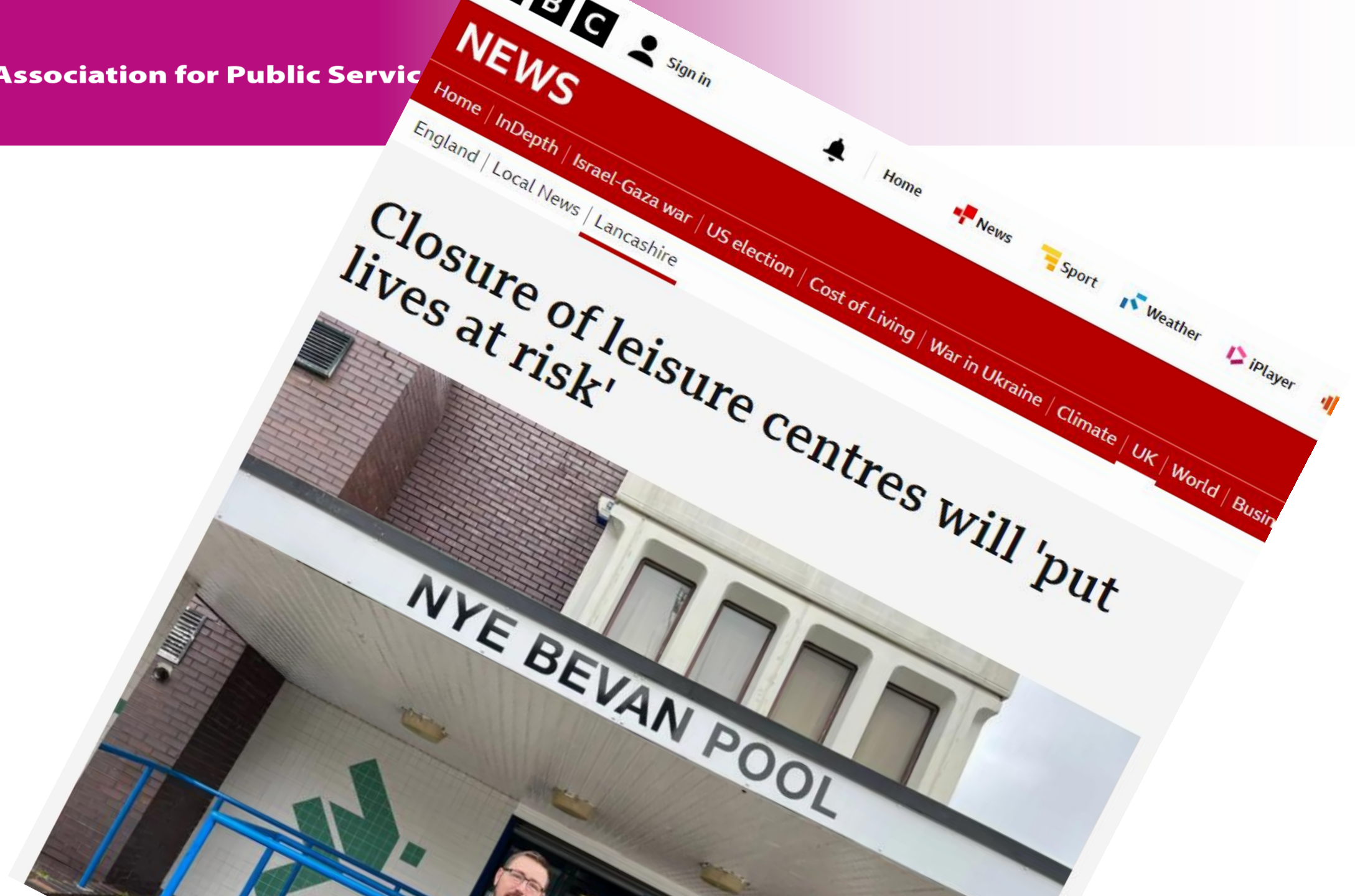


Plans for full local government reorganisation could be mooted as soon as this week's Budget, The MJ understands.

Details of plans for a complete overhaul of the sector are expected to be unveiled when the Government announces its English devolution Bill, expected in mid to late November, but the first hints may become apparent when chancellor Rachel Reeves makes her announcement on Wednesday.

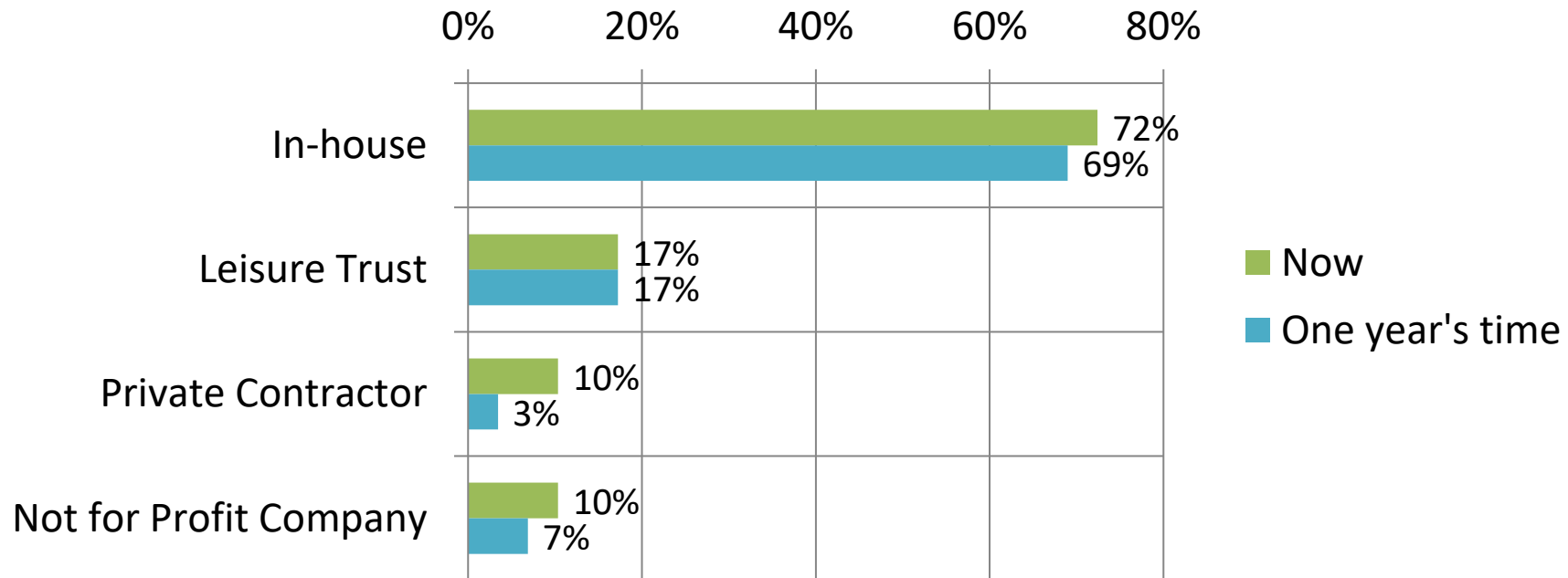

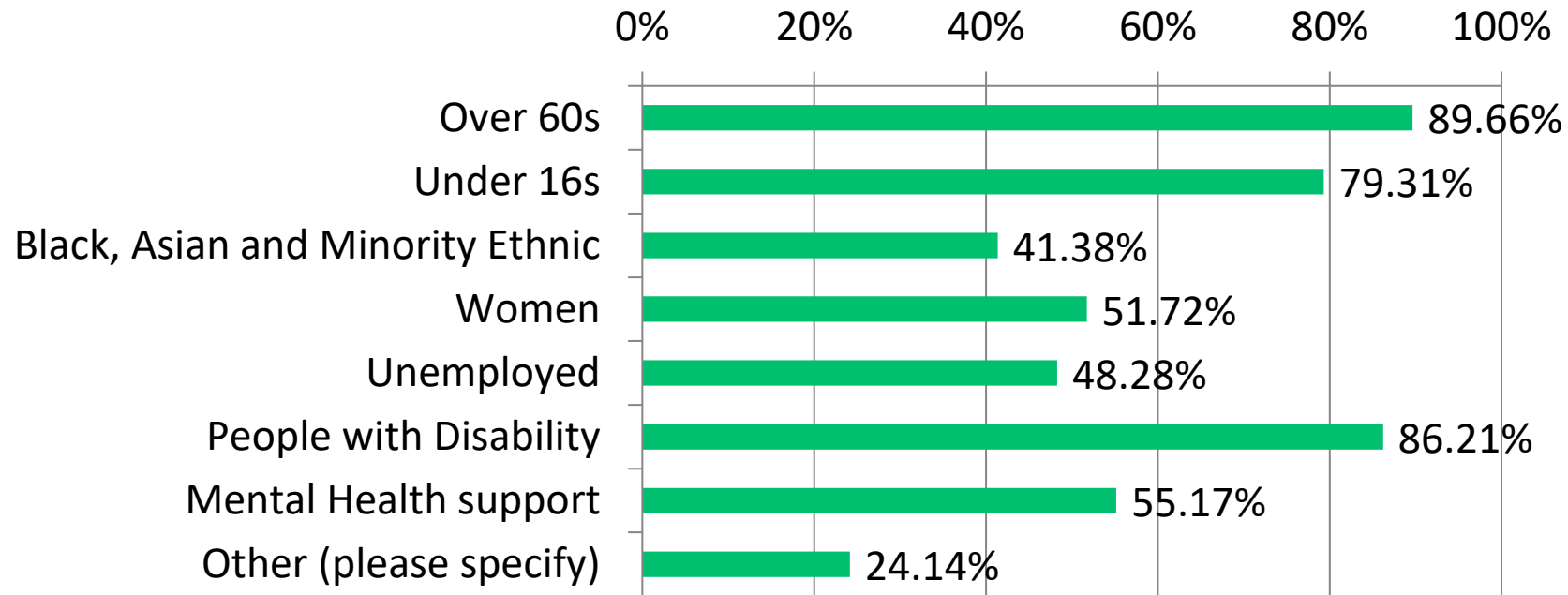

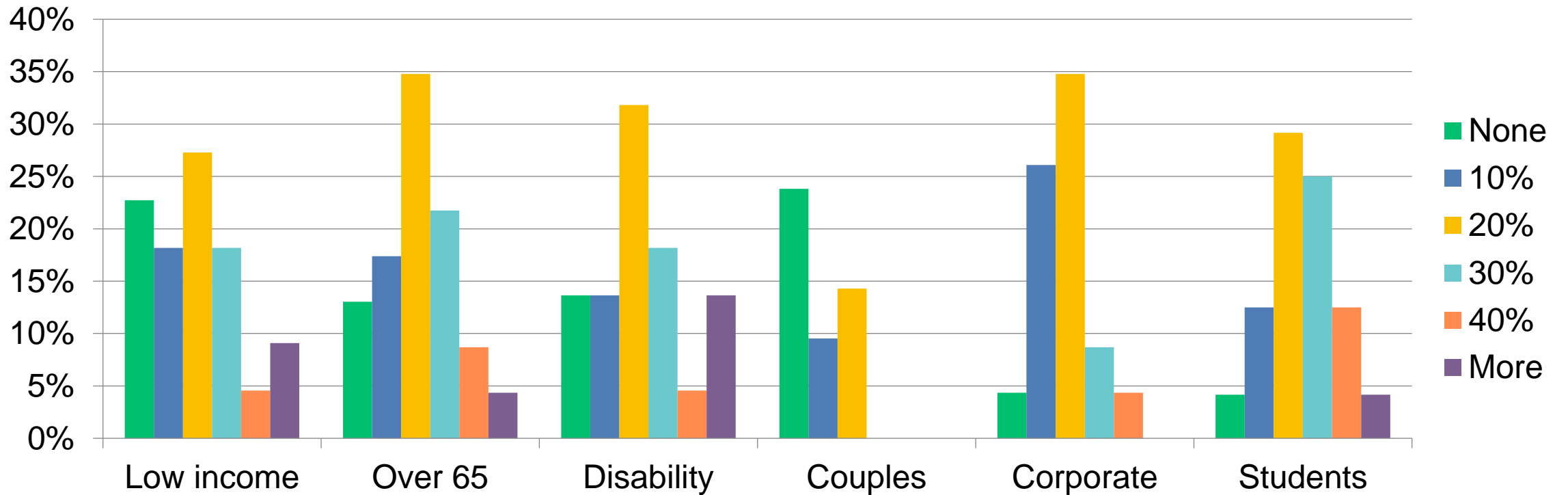
Who manages leisure now and who do you expect to manage it in 12 months' time?



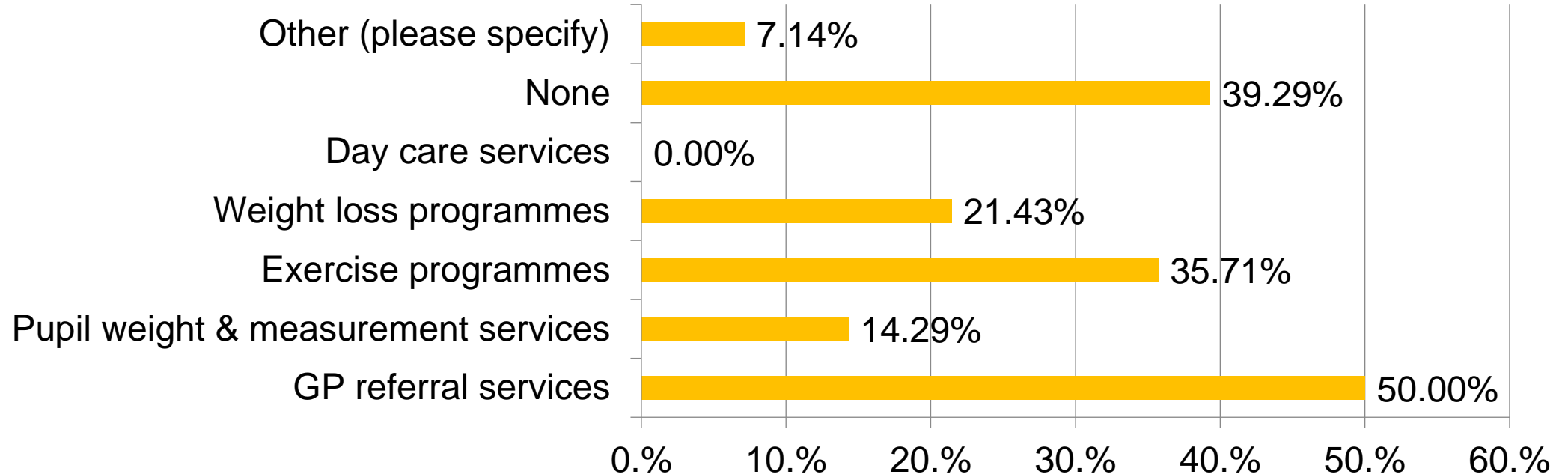
Do you actively encourage participation from particular groups within the community? e.g. promotions, reduced charges, specific closed sessions?



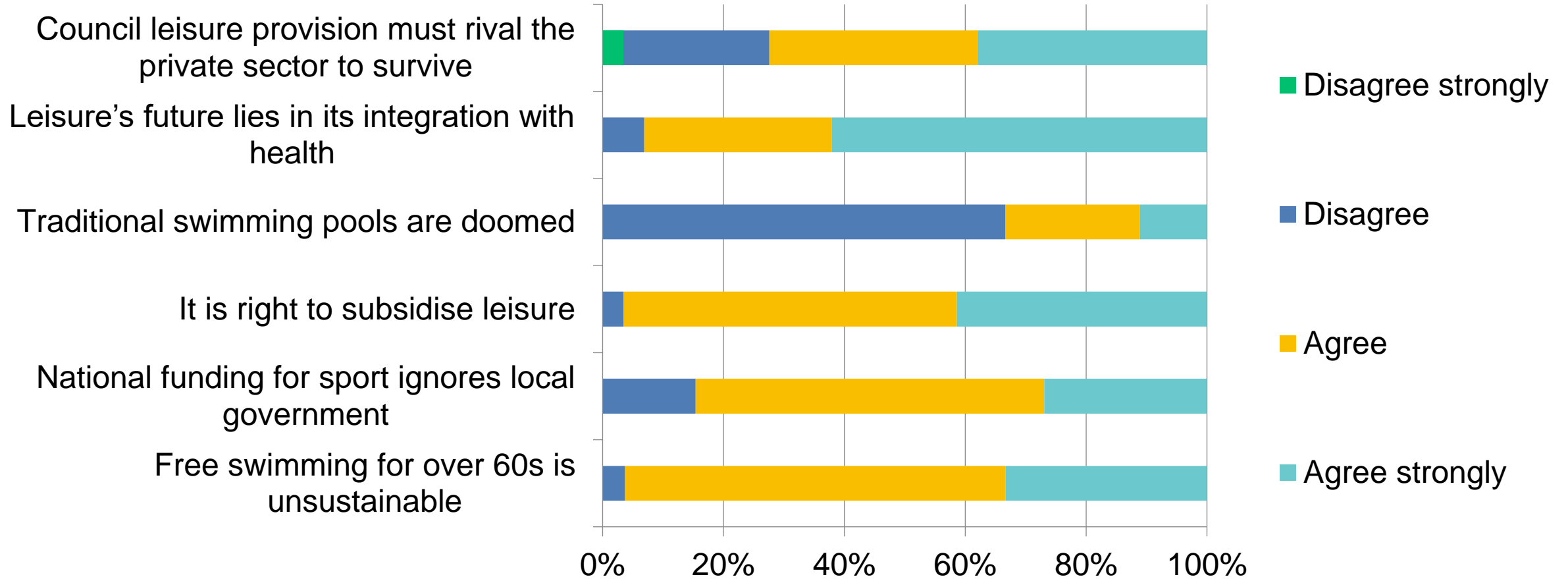

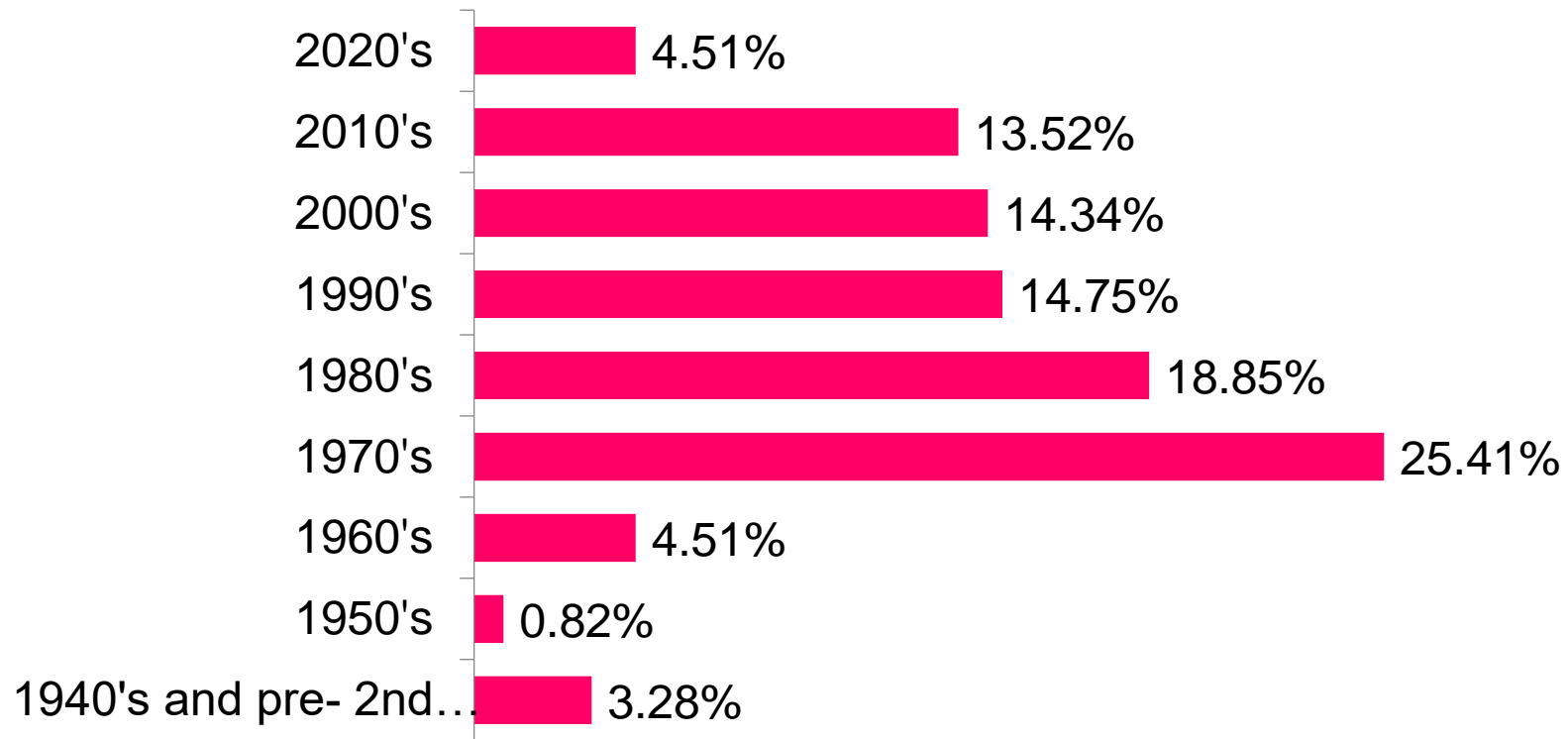

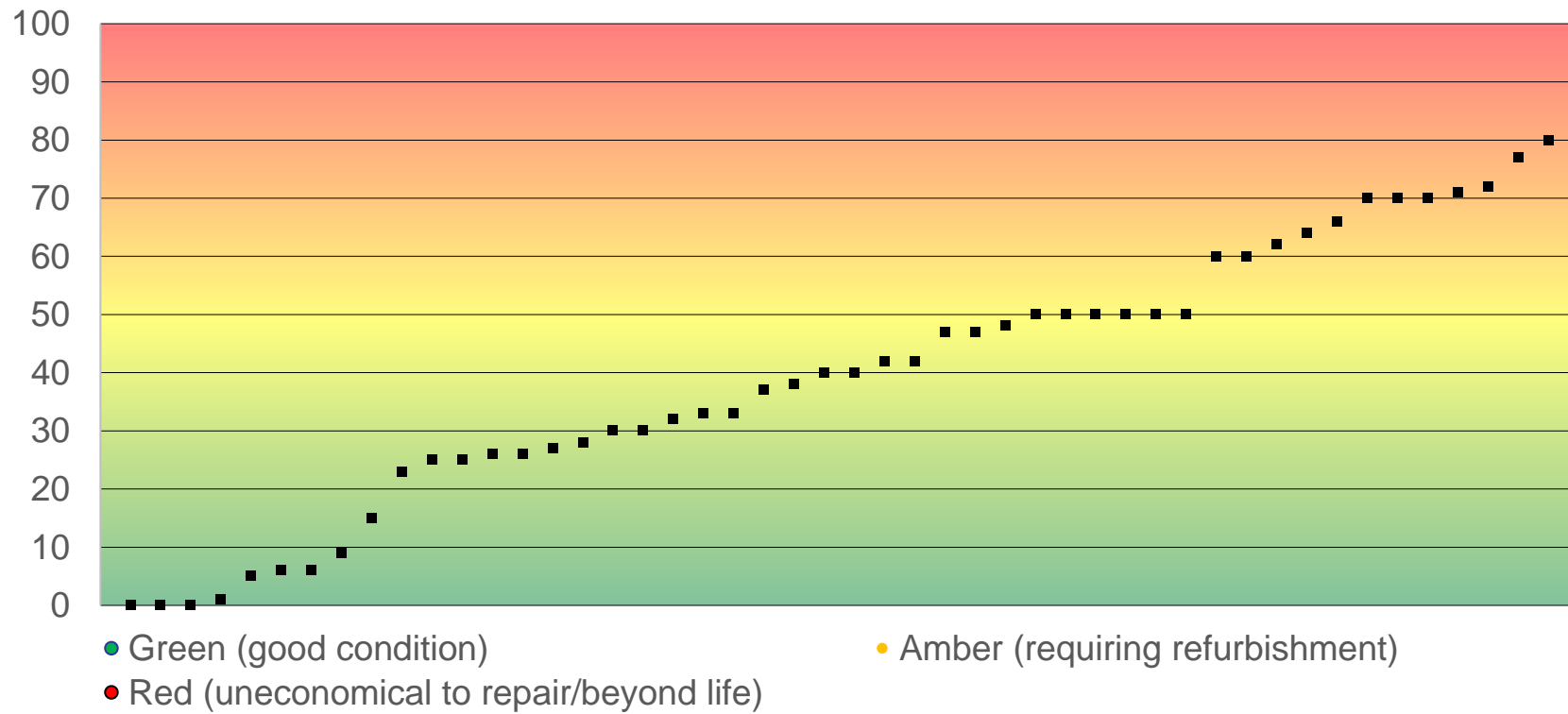

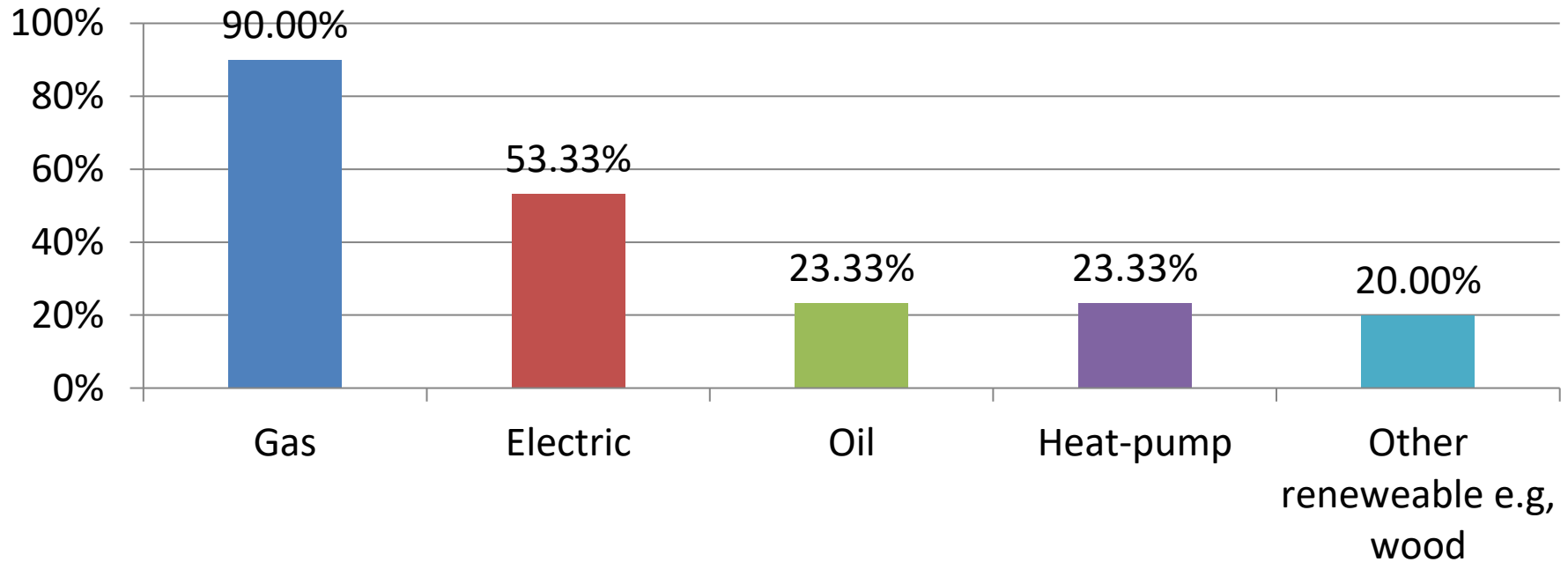
When were your leisure facilities first built?



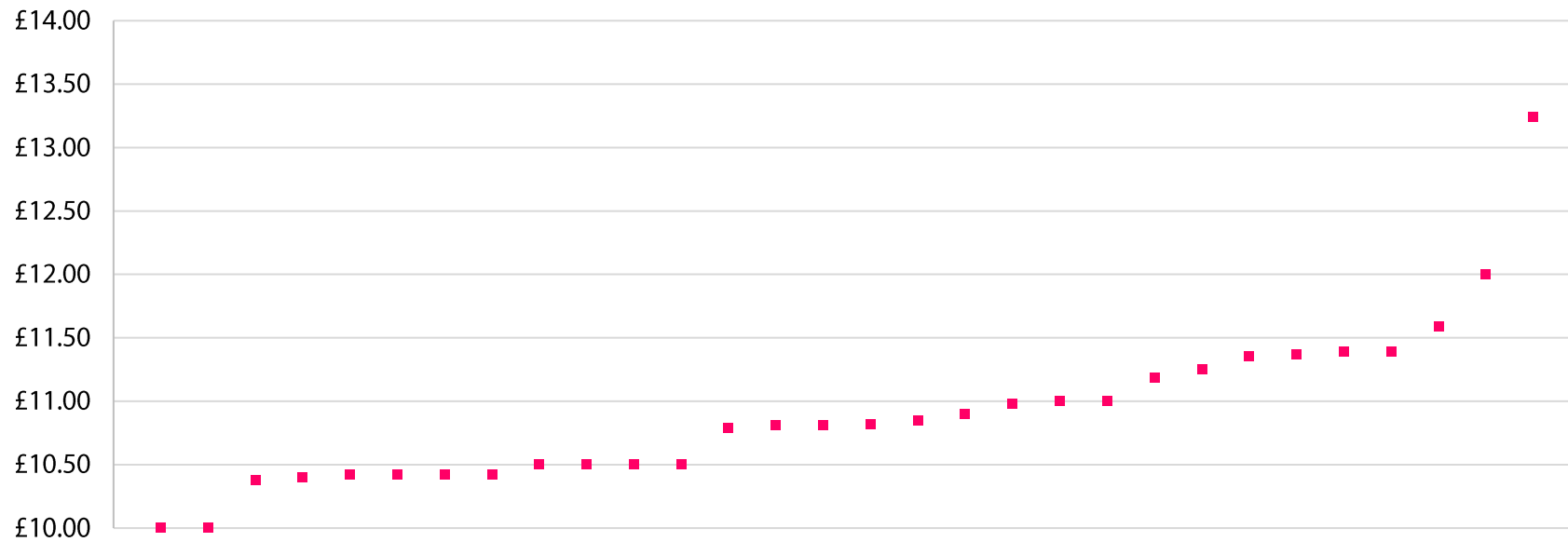
Overall, how would you rate your average facility?



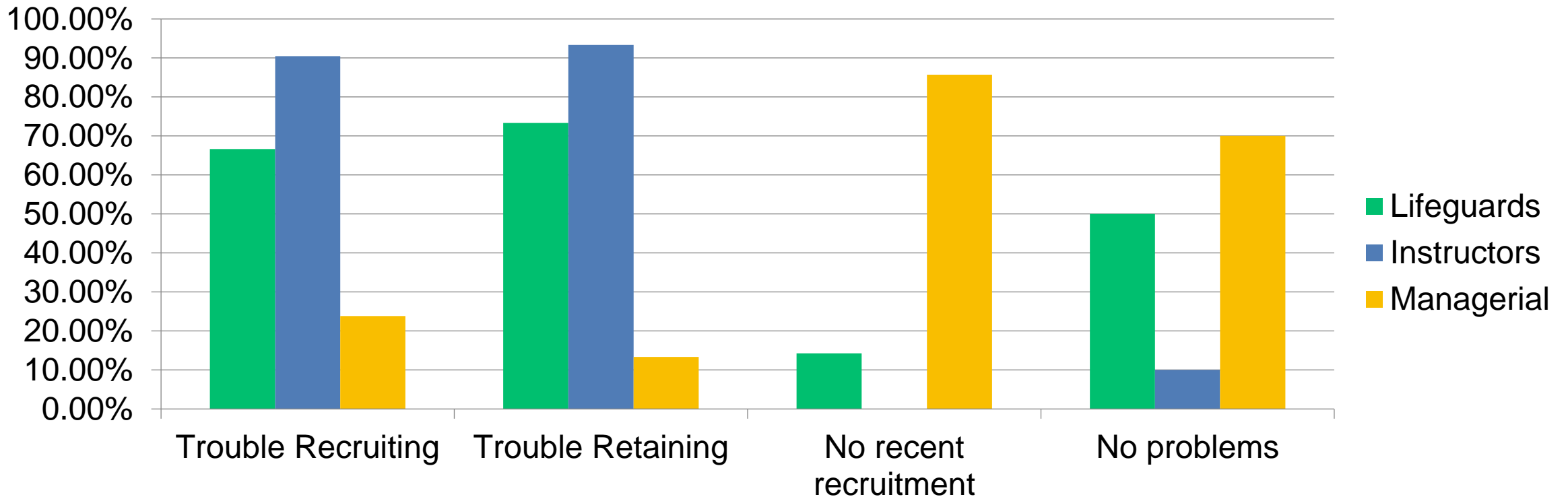
How are your facilities heated?
