#### What is DRS?

- Improve capture of target materials, increase quality of material, reduce litter and contribute to the development of a circular economy
- Examples in Europe, US, Canada, Australia etc.
- Extended producer responsibility

#### **DRS for Scotland**

- Consultation launched on 27 June 2018
- Includes consultation, OBC, BRIA, EQiA and SEA
- Stakeholder involvement
- No preferred option
- Feedback on components
- Four example schemes presented







## **Principles**

- Increase the quantity of target materials collected for recycling;
- Improve the quality of material collected, to allow for higher value recycling;
- Encourage wider behaviour change around materials;
- Deliver maximum economic and societal benefits for Scotland.












#### **Headline LA 25 Year NPV**

- Example 1 £110m (£494m for Scotland)
- Example 2 £146m (£352 for Scotland)
- Example 3 £149m (£745m for Scotland)
- Example 4 £168m (£990m for Scotland)





#### **Local Authorities and DRS**

- Focus on disposal costs, further benefits likely to arise from:
  - Operational efficiencies from collecting less material
  - Operational efficiencies from emptying litter bins less frequently
- Other interactions with local authority services:
  - Trading standards, Environmental Health, Care at Home, Economic Development, Facilities Management, Schools, Sport, Leisure & Culture, Planning etc.
- Local businesses
- Local environment
- Local economy
