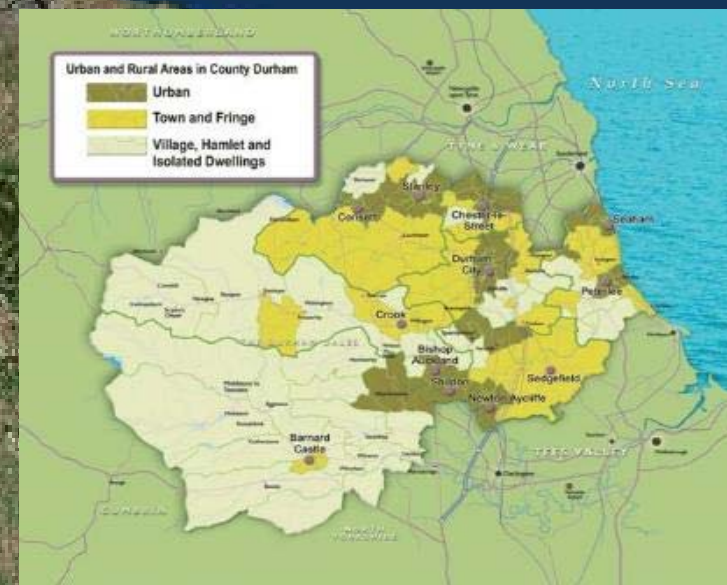

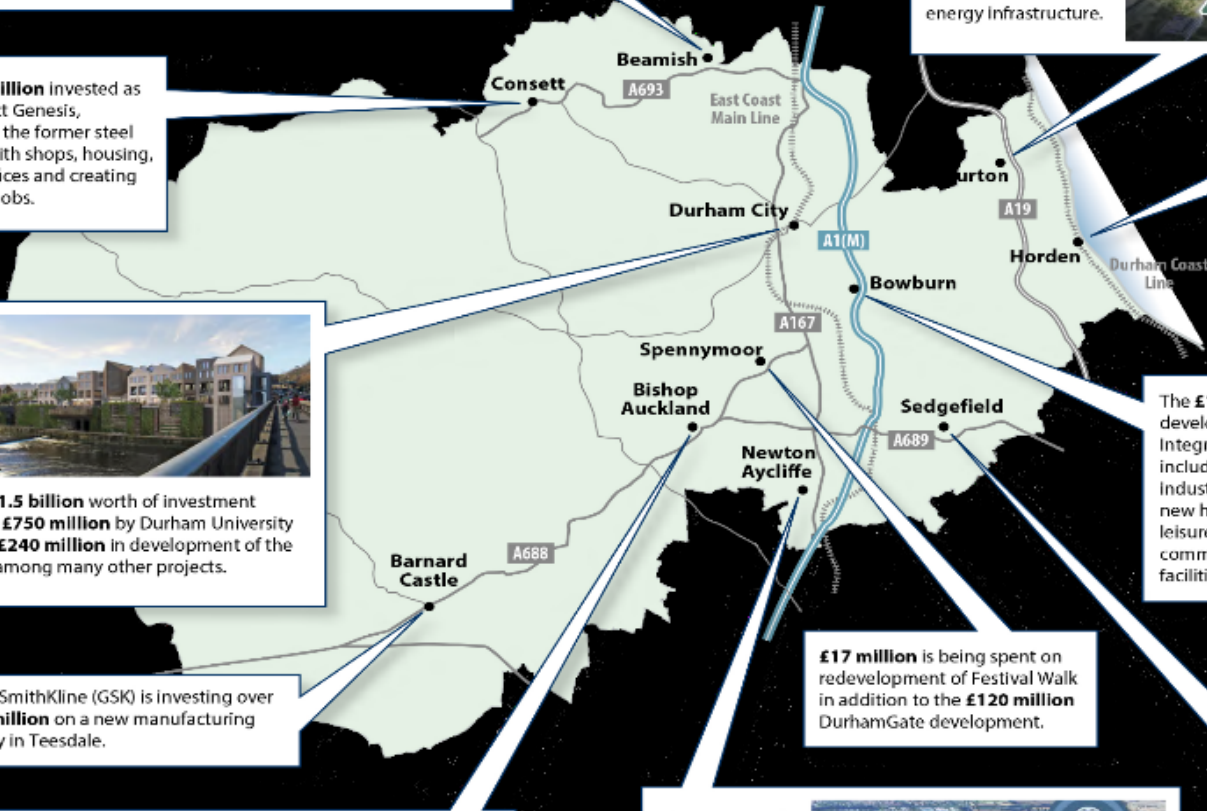
Beamish Museum investing **£17 million** on its new 1950s town, upland farm and Georgian coaching inn.



Creation of the **£20 million** Jade Enterprise Zone also bringing forward improvements to A19 junction and internal roads as well as new energy infrastructure.



Over **£100 million** invested as part of Project Genesis, regenerating the former steel works area with shops, housing, parks and offices and creating hundreds of jobs.



A new **£13 million** Horden railway station will unlock potential opportunities for further developments.



A new business district on the current site of County Hall could potentially creating up to **6,000 new jobs** – find out more at www.durham.gov.uk/AykleyHeads



Almost **£1.5 billion** worth of investment including **£750 million** by Durham University and over **£240 million** in development of the riverside among many other projects.

The **£115 million** development of Integra 61 including an industrial park, new housing, leisure and community facilities.



GlaxoSmithKline (GSK) is investing over **£90 million** on a new manufacturing facility in Teesdale.

£17 million is being spent on redevelopment of Festival Walk in addition to the **£120 million** DurhamGate development.

Further expansion of NETPark, the county's leading technology business park, has seen **£271 million** invested in the creation of a Centre for Innovation In Formulation, infrastructure for phase 3 and an Explorer building.



Over **£200 million** worth of investment including the successful Kynren, The Auckland Project's work on Auckland Castle, creation of a Faith Museum, art galleries, walled garden and Auckland Tower welcome centre.



The Forrest Park project will see a **£153 million** expansion of Aycliffe Business Park including a new road and energy infrastructure.

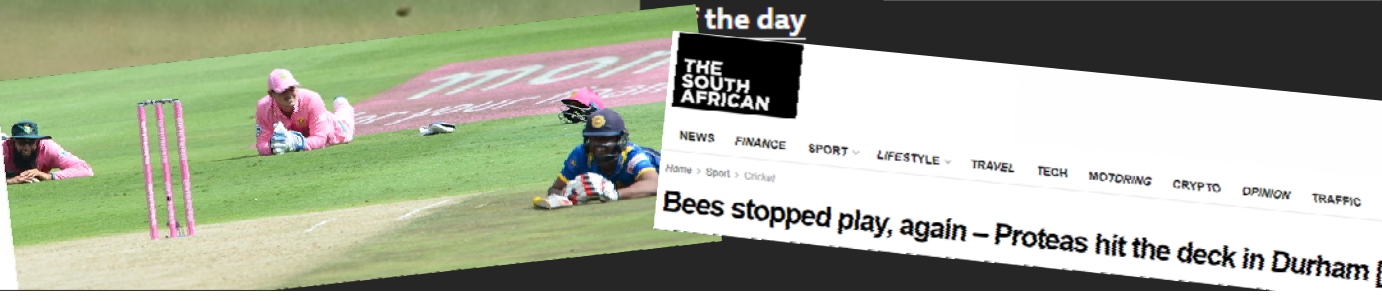

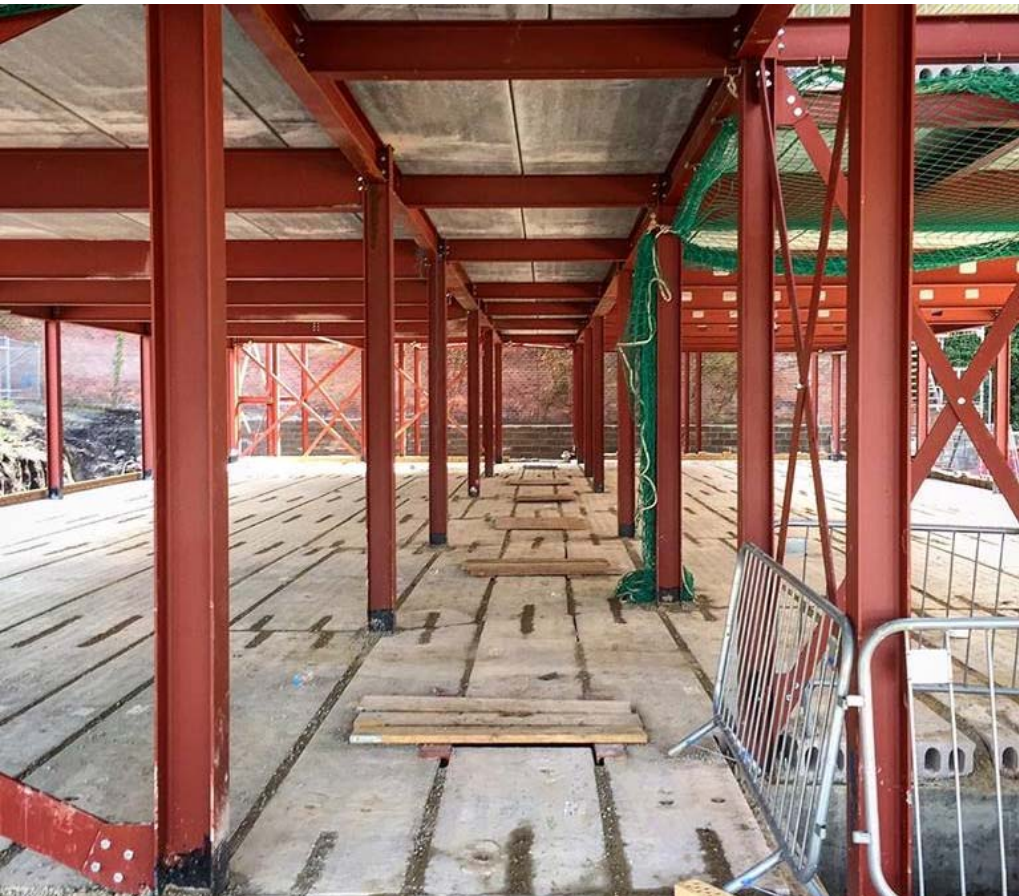
