

Addressing Energy Affordability



- East Midlands moved from 7th to 1st position for price competitiveness – all tariffs
- Tariffs are now approx. £118 cheaper in East Midlands

- More suppliers now competing in PAYG space since RHE launched their prepayment tariff

APSE Energy Our Vision




