- Run on a strictly **not-for-profit** basis and aimed predominantly at the domestic sector.
- Fully licenced for Commercial supply.
- Feed in Tariff supported
- We operate throughout mainland UK.

# Addressing Energy Affordability



- East Midlands moved from 7<sup>th</sup> to 1<sup>st</sup> position for price competitiveness – all tariffs
- Tariffs are now approx. £118 cheaper in East Midlands than when RHE first launched
- All consumers benefitting from Robin Hood Energy launch
- More suppliers now competing in PAYG space since RHE launched their prepayment tariff
- Reaching out to communities and completing analysis on fuel poverty at ward level

## Our Vision



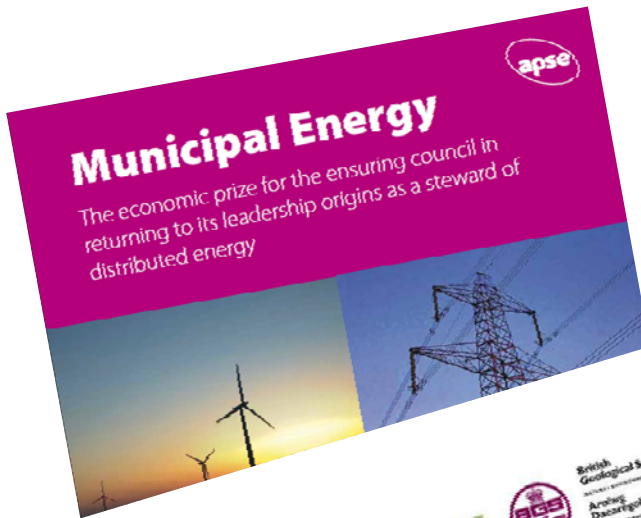

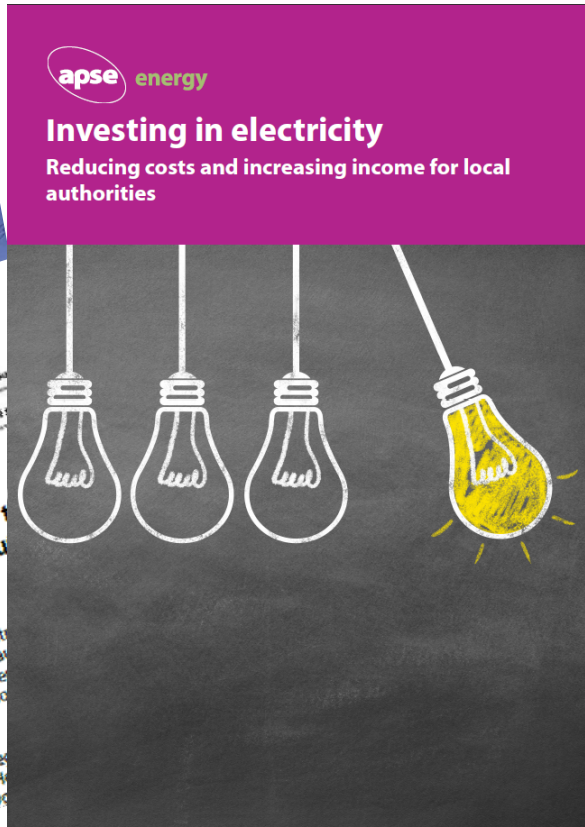


## APSE Energy Briefing Note 5/17 - Now is the time to consider underground heat for your local authority

### 1. Introduction

Recent UK Government announcements have reaffirmed a commitment to internationally agreed carbon targets. Meanwhile local planning authorities are demanding reductions in carbon emissions from new developments, specifying connection to district heating networks supplied by local sources.

The new Department of Business, Energy and Industrial Strategy has endorsed the use of renewable heat through the Renewable Heat Incentive. Government are also supporting development of heat networks.
