Regulation

- The Social Housing (Regulation) Act 2023 received Royal Assent on 20 July 2023.
- Scottish Housing Regulator Introducing a new Framework on 1 April 2024
- Welsh Housing Quality Standard 2023 Expected to be finalised and launched – Autumn 2023

- Welsh Government <u>Social housing conditions and disrepair</u>


Reinforced Autoclaved Aerated Concrete (RAAC)

- A safety alert was published in May 2019
- It was used construction of some public buildings like schools and hospitals between the 1950s and 1990s.
- Has a life span of approximately 30 years
- Hit the headlines at the beginning of September when several schools were forced to partially of fully close
- 156 schools and 34 hospitals


To boiler or not to boiler?

- 20 September 2023 the UK Prime Minister outlined changes to current climate policies
- Ban on the sale of oil, LPG and new heating for off-gas-grid homes pushed back from 2026 to 2035
- Other bans to fossil-fuel boilers, such as the ban on using in new homes and the wider 2035 ban remain in place








Expectation of personal workload in the next 2 or 3 years




Staff Absence




Repairs
