- Efficiency
- Demand management

Efficiency



- Increased output with same or reduced input
 - Productivity
- Removal of waste
 - Inputs that do not add output value

Likely sources of efficiency savings



- Better resource utilisation
 - Reduced vehicle down time
- Reduced wages bill
 - Design overtime and shift payments out by designing against actual demand
- Improved business process
 - Remove hand offs and stop batching work
 - Just in time supplies
- Stop doing things that don't need doing
 - Cleaning clean buildings
- Eliminate failure demand
 - Right first time approach

Demand



- Increasing demand to reduce marginal cost
 - School meals
 - Marketing
 - Branding
 - Pricing
- Reducing demand to reduce total cost
 - Cleaning
 - Self cleaning
 - Removing bins from desks

Seeing the bigger picture



- Impact on wider public sector cost centres
 - Why de we provide these services?
- Increased demand for school meals
 - Positive impact on education, child health, economy etc
- Reduced demand for cleaning
 - Is self cleaning an efficient use of time?


Innovation

But has wider implications (appear)






Demand innovation

Demand innovation: McDonalds


