



3x Big Ballot Bins were trialled in each location. Positioned in central, visible, high-footfall locations along the main shopping streets in each city. The positioning was supported by baseline data showing litter hotspot areas which either had no bin or poorly performing bins.

"I think every Taylor Swift fan in the area is going to be throwing away everything they own"



"The Ballot Bins have been a huge success. Additionally, we performed on-street surveying in both locations to quantify the public's perception of the Big Ballot Bins.

Here is what we found out...

Saw voting bins as a good way to reduce litter

70%

Had a conversation about Big Ballot Bins with someone after using them

56%

More likely to use a Big Ballot Bin than a regular bin

54%

Noticed Big Ballot Bins in their local area

61%


Our survey had 114 responses from members of the public in Manchester and Southampton.




