



- Founded March 2008 at a meeting of 9 local/town-wide Forums with a combined membership of 398 local Friends groups.
- Originally the National Open Spaces Forum (NOSF), grew to 29 local Forums, representing over 1,500 friends of parks groups
- constituted in Feb 2010







- Chair Wirral Parks and Countryside Partnership & Performance Board (3 times a year).



Developing skills for the 21st Century Parks Manager

- Government and Parks Sector experts looking at a number of work streams
- APSE skills and knowledge workstream
- 2 Focus Group this year
- On-line survey to APSE parks contacts in England
- One-to-one interviews with 20+ professionals
- Statistical and thematic analysis of data gathered.
- Looked at: responsibilities; skills needs; skills gaps, training providers.

Aims

- Develop clearly defined set of skills for managers and staff responsible for parks.
- Develop competency framework for different stages of career and attach to JD's and person specifications.
- Consideration of module skills learning depending on existing level of skills and knowledges e.g. horticulture, commercialisation.
- Identify relevant training providers as well as plugging training needs gaps.
- Develop career pathway to enhance future productivity, recruitment and retention of parks personnel at all levels.
